MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

(Please note that these meeting minutes are a brief summary and are not the final approved version.)

SELECTBOARD

No meeting held 02/02/15.

02/16/15. Present: N. Tift, G. Fredette, R. Regula, and M. Tessier

Jay White, representing Chipman Lodge #52 (Masonic), reported on the sale of their property. He requested use of the Town Hall second floor for meetings-10x/year. The Board approved his request with the consideration of a donation to redo the floors.

The Board approved Fire Chief Stefane Goulet's request to approve a resolution urging the governor to oppose eliminating dispatching services in Rutland and Derby.

Highland Homesites Association has appealed the lot line adjustment permit issued to Tom Phillips & the Town of Wallingford on the Route 140W/Waldo Lane property.

The Board signed the 2013 Annual Lister Certificate – No Appeal or Suit Pending form.

The Board signed the rental agreement with HP Fairfield for a roadside mower for one week in August.

The Board chose low bidder, F.A.S. Trucking & Landscaping for 2015 mowing.

Assessor John Tiffany's request to attend a NEMRC seminar on 2/26 was approved.

The Board approved Beth Sheeche's request to name her private road off Route 7 South, whereby the adjacent property owner has a right-of-way. She will be responsible for the street sign expense.

G. Fredette would like the Recreation Committee to forward an Elfin Lake pavilion proposal to the Selectboard, so the town can contact G.E. to arrange for volunteer labor.

The Board appointed Gary Wells as Emergency Mgt. Coordinator, upon Jerry Tift's resignation.


M. Tessier reported on Act 148 deadlines and the fact that the town would be required to accept yard waste like leaves, brush and debris in the future. He said the town could assess fees.

Catamount Electric would like to offer annual fire alarm inspections and repair services at Town Hall. Service rates will be obtained. However, they do not inspect fire extinguishers.

The board had no response to Michelle Wade's email request for property tax relief.

The board approved S. Switzer's idea of monthly Open Mic nights at Town Hall featuring area musicians. S. Switzer said non-profit groups could host fundraiser bake sales at the events.

RECREATION COMMITTEE

02/04/15. Present: L. Marchinkoski, D. Baker, and T. Nash

There was discussion about the Summer Rec program and personnel. The positions will be advertised now.

The Committee discussed what weeks to hold this year's program. Dates for the RSSU camp have not been set and that it may run five weeks instead of three. The Committee agreed to proceed with same format as last year, with no camp during the three weeks when RSSU camp has traditionally been held. Our program will be June 22-26, June 29-July 3, July 27-31, August 3-7, and August 10-14.

There was discussion on program ideas and expectations for this summer. Many new ideas will be shared with the Director, as well as expectations for programming. The Committee plans to advertise during voting at Town Hall.

Lisa shared that we have the funds to correct the vandalism at the rec field. We will investigate the damage after the snow melts. We will create a list of what has been and what still needs to be done.

The Committee discussed whether to obtain a professional estimate on what may be needed to fix the tennis courts. The Committee agreed to work on this, this year, if possible.

PRUDENTIAL COMMITTEE

01/21/15. Present: S. Sendra, K. Stocker, and G. Wells

Maureen gave an update on the lead & copper testing and the schedule for the coming year. At this point, we do not have to make any changes to our water system. Letters will go out with the next billing explaining the test and how people can make sure they have the proper equipment in their house. Vermont law prohibits the use of lead in fittings and meters.

Maureen reported on a water line break at the corner of Circular and Nash. Repairs were done and a couple of valves may be installed in the spring so only a few houses have to be shut down and not the whole area.

Kandie is taking college classes on Wednesday and Thursday evenings starting late January through first week of May. The Board voted to move meetings to the 2nd and 4th Monday evenings through April.

02/11/15. Present: S. Sendra, K. Stocker, and G. Wells

The board discussed sidewalk snowplowing alternatives if Jim Bowen is not able to plow. G. Wells said he could fill in when needed. He also agreed to give Jim access to the firehouse when the snowplow needs maintenance.

The Lead and Copper permit was issued by the state. At this time no additive is necessary in our system as only one home had an issue and has been fixed.

The board reviewed the monthly financials.

The board asked Jim if there are any projects needed to be done at the lodge this coming year. Jim reported on some small items at his cabin that were added to the budget. The lodge budget was finalized and a small increase in the rental rates will be necessary.

Jim asked about compensating Michael for the work he did while Jim was laid up in January. The Board approved this request.

The board discussed the FY16 General Budget, which will show a small decrease from this year. The clerk's printer will be purchased vs. leasing. The Board approved a 3% increase in the clerk and treasurer's salaries as well as an increase for the Prudential Committee members. The total budget came in at \$74,310.

WALLINGFORD ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

01/20/15. Present: K. Fredette, S. Pytlik, P. Rondinone, T. Lidstone, and J. Rodgers.

(Carousel Meeting) The board discussed the Transfer Program excluding Pre-K from the agreement until FY16, when Act 66 comes into effect. The boards agreed in keeping the agreement as it is currently, pertaining to K-6 students. Mr. Younce received suggestions for the "Articles of Agreement" and will bring a final copy to the next board meetings for approval.

CES Principal, Fred Valastro, spoke to the board regarding "School Dude" - a web-based data system that tracks maintenance requests, keeps records of ordering inventory, manages routine maintenance to facilities, and generates pm work orders that can be monitored online. The program would cost the SU \$2,225 in the first year, and then \$1,295 the following years. Elementary school administrators will preview a "School Dude" demo on January 21st.

Agenda topics for the next meeting were discussed. The board moved into executive session for the purpose of the bargaining update.

(Regular Meeting) The Board discussed the budget and approved the expenditure budget of \$2,293,735 for operation of the elementary school in FY16. They also approved warning \$18,000 for the building sinking fund. The warning was also adopted.

The Board had a brief discussion on kitchen equipment being installed.

The Board approved the Purchase and Sale agreement of the Little Red School House.

The Board discussed facilities project oversight, asbestos abatement, and carousel meetings.

02/05/15. Present: K. Fredette, S. Pytlik, J. Rodgers, and P. Rondinone

H. Richards-Peele discussed possibilities of a collaborative effort with All Star Daycare to provide before and after school childcare for preschoolers in the building. Grant monies may be available for transition.

D. Younce advised that the potential buyer for the Little Red Schoolhouse withdrew their offer, however, another party has expressed an interest.

The board discussed possible changes to the carousel meeting schedule/format. The board had a brief discussion on Committee roles and responsibilities.


Kitchen is up and running; still waiting on the hand wash sink and the new dishwasher booster.

WALLINGFORD ELEMENTARY PRE-K SCHOOL NEWS



If you answered "yes" to any of the questions above


YOU NEED TO TAKE ACTION.

Any of these situations could result in a fine.

- Faded Vermont License Plates – A new set of license plates will be issued to you at no cost. Requests for replacement of the same number (other than low numbers and vanity plates) will require a \$20 payment by the customer.
- Registration Validation Sticker Placement - Request a free replacement sticker from the DMV and affix that sticker to the correct location on your rear plate.
- Obstructed Registration Plates – License plate frames obstruct the view of the registration validation sticker or the words "Vermont" or "Green Mountain State." These must be removed from your vehicle.
