
Vermonters can now register to vote online!

MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

(Please note that these meeting minutes are a brief summary and are not the final approved version.)

SELECTBOARD

12/07/15. Present: N. Tift, R. Regula, G. Fredette, and B. Brooks

Phil Baker discussed the invoice from Green Mountain Kenworth. He will be available for snowplowing or road maintenance if needed. Mr. Baker will be moving the trees piled near the transfer station. There was a discussion regarding VOSHA compliance standards. Sandi Switzer plans to attend a training session in Brandon in January with Road Foreman Steve Lanfear, hosted by RRPC. She added she was working with RRPC to schedule a February training session in Wallingford on the proper handling and labeling of hazardous waste. M. Tessier suggested contacting the fire chief to assist with compliance issues.

The board reviewed an AOT letter regarding the annual reporting of special weight limits on roads and bridges. Sandi will follow up with Steve Lanfear.

John McLallen brought up some issues he had with the road crew activities.

Jay White said the Masons were interested in investing proceeds from the sale of their building in order to establish a scholarship fund. The Masons would like to partner with the town and establish a fund through Vermont Community Foundation. The board gave preliminary approval to proceed.

There was a brief discussion regarding the dedication, but no decision was made.

The Selectboard approved the installation of side railings for the front steps at Town Hall; issuing a letter regarding a barking dog complaint; issuing a letter about junk vehicles. There was a brief discussion regarding moving the gate on Elfin Lake Road closer to Route 140W.

G. Fredette said the Scholarship Committee wanted to update the criteria for distributing annual scholarships.

S. Switzer will seek an estimate from Enman Kesselring Engineering to inspect and provide a written report on the Creek Road Bridge. The board signed a letter to RRTC urging the Creek Road Bridge be added to the top of the county's transportation priority list.

FY'17 Public Safety, Conservation Commission, and Recreation budgets were discussed.

PC members Erika Berner and Jeff Biasuzzi was considering applying for a grant for crosswalks. They were given authority to discuss the plan with AOT officials further.

Troy Minerals Solar Project in South Wallingford was discussed. Joyce Barbieri questioned the expansion of the industrial zone in South Wallingford in the zoning regulations.

12/21/15. Present: N. Tift, R. Regula, M. Tessier, G. Fredette, and B. Brooks

After discussion with Road Commissioner Phil Baker, approval was given to buy tires for the 2014 Kenworth and the grader. Mr. Baker will provide details and estimates at the next meeting for a Better Backroad Grant project.

FY17 Highway and Appropriations budgets were discussed.

Representatives from Samesun and Troy Minerals, along with the Zoning Administrator, discussed the solar project at length.

Derek Farmer resigned from the Planning Commission.

Tinmouth is no longer allowed to accept electronic waste. Wallingford must accept Tinmouth's ewaste since the town's transfer station is registered as a state ewaste facility. TS employees will monitor the amount of ewaste collected and request citizens return another day when gaylords were full.

There was discussion regarding VLCT's workers' compensation requirements for all sub-contractors and whether that would pertain it would pertain to our "handyman" who is also a town employee.

PLANNING COMMITTEE

12/08/15. Present: E. Berner, J. Burkett, J. Biasuzzi, and C. Martin

The Commission discussed the ACCD/VTrans-sponsored "Strong Communities, Better Connections Grant". It will be discussed with the Selectboard later this month.

Jeff distributed copies of an improved format of the newly adopted zoning regulations. Members will comment at next meeting.

Members were asked to review the Town Plan in preparation of update assignments. A draft of the PC's report for the town report was also distributed for review and comments.

Jill discussed the issue of screening future solar projects and handed out the recent commentary by VT Sen. Joseph Benning on future energy generation issues. Jill was asked to draft a section on screening requirements for future commercial ground-mounted solar facilities, telecommunication towers, and quarries or pits for the next update of zoning regulations. A section for decommissioning and retirement of retired facilities should also be added.

PRUDENTIAL COMMITTEE

12/02/15. Present: S. Sendra and K. Stocker

Kandie spoke to her boss about having the furnace finished at the caretaker's cabin, a requirement of the fire marshal. Maureen reported she's had no luck getting the welder to attach the V-Plow on the tractor. She will look for another welder to get this done as it could snow any day now.

The Prudential Committee received a letter from someone interested serving on the Committee. It was uncertain if it is a conflict for a Selectboard member to also serve on the Prudential Committee. Maureen will contact the Secretary of State on this. The vacancy posting will remain until we get an answer.

Maureen distributed the fire marshal's report concerning his inspection of the caretaker's cabin. We have 30 days to get some items done. Scott will help Gary get the deck railings completed. Maureen has an electrician coming to install hardwire smoke detectors.

The board reviewed the old contract with the caretaker. They will finalize it at the next meeting before it is sent to the attorney for final approval. Once the attorney approves it, Gary and the Board will sign it.

12/16/15. Present: S. Sendra and K. Stocker

The board made several changes to the caretaker's agreement. Maureen will type up the new one and send it to the attorney for her final approval and it will then be signed by all parties involved. All items on the fire marshal's inspection have been completed or will be finished by the end of the week and we will have a follow up inspection on Monday, December 21st.

Maureen received another letter of interest for the vacancy on the Prudential Committee. The board will look over the information from the Secretary of State and make their final recommendation to the Selectboard at the next meeting.

The board reviewed and approved the monthly financials.

The Board will work on the Fire Protection budget on January 13th. Scott reported on the recent Scholarship Committee meeting and said they are revamping the rules to qualify for one of the scholarships this next year.

11/19/15. Present: P. Rondinone, S. Pytlik, J. Rodgers, and T. Lidstone

RSSU Business Manager Stan Pawlaczyk explained the process that was followed to find a new copier and copier company. He passed out copies of the bid up for approval to the board.

Principal Helen Richards-Peele distributed a written report. She updated the board on the new heating system. The board discussed the hours of the new custodial staff.

The Board discussed the Superintendent's report that included: an Update on the Act 46 committee, an update on the contract bargaining, an update on the budget progress, and a request in regards to the book study.

Stan distributed a summary of the budget and supporting documents and reviewed the preliminary budget for FY17. The board discussed the possibility for a foreign language program/position as the idea of combining the program with Clarendon is no longer an option. The board briefly discussed the preschool program and the possible surplus from FY16.

Paul was appointed to sub for Ken at the RSSU board meeting on November 23. Janine was also appointed to sub for Shannon at the RSSU meeting on November 23.

S. Pawlaczyk reviewed the budget documents with the Board.

Principal Richards-Peele reported on the building punch list report, and several school-related activities occurring.

RSSU Superintendent D. Younce reported on the Act 46 Committee actions and progress. He spoke with a realtor about the Little Red Schoolhouse with little results and asked the Board for guidance.

The Board discussed the two WES Board seats that will be open in March along with the four members needed for the new unified district board (if approved by voters).

Janine was appointed as a voting member on the RSSU Board, as Shannon is stepping down.

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

Lost Bird film showing was a success Discussed future showings and an occasional film at the Town Hall with big screen and projector. Marc gave a presentation about Stone Meadow to the Rotarians who were very enthusiastic and renewed their pledge to help us with the split rail fence in the spring. We will try for presentations on recycling and composting in the spring.

8 new trees were planted in front of the parking area. We have a bee person who would like to set up a few hives in the meadow in the spring. Marc will submit a preliminary application to the Recreation Trails Program for a grant to lower the exposed pipe across Otter Creek on Waldo Lane for the continuance of the canoe trail. Ralph will follow up with the Carving Studio for our sign.

Last year's "winter day" activities were so popular that we have to do it again. There was some discussion of having it at the beach and using the Pavilion as a shelter and moving the sliding area.

We will tidy-up around the newly planted trees at the parking area on December 6.

We will ask the Selectboard permission to send a letter to the VT Railroad about their slashing of trees along the railroad tracks in the village. We may go to South Wallingford to see the proposed 150KW solar farm. Consider election of officers in the near future. This year's expenses vs. budget and next year's budget proposal were discussed.





Snowplowing Reminders

It is unlawful to plow snow across a town highway or street in a way that leaves snow in the roadway. Violation of this law may result in a \$100.00 fine plus the actual costs of repairing any damage resulting from such obstruction of the highway. (Title 19 V.S.A. 1105).

It is unlawful to cause water or ice to run onto a town highway or street in such a way that it causes damage to the highway or street, obstructs traffic, or creates unsafe conditions. (Title 19 V.S.A. 1111).
