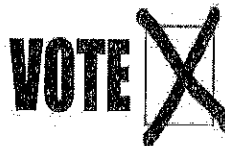

MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

(Please note that these meeting minutes are a brief summary and are not the final approved version.)

SELECTBOARD

09/06/16. Present: B. Brooks, N. Tift, R. Regula, and G. Fredette

The board reviewed documents from Brian Plumer detailing the Highland Beach Association's concern regarding water draining from Route 140W resulting in silt and sand issues on the group's tennis court. Road Commissioner Phil Baker offered to meet with him to discuss the matter further.

Mr. Baker reported that Pike Industries would begin paving 9/8. B. Brooks noted Road Foreman Steve Lanfear asked if the town could use a portion of the gravel budget for paving projects; however, some of the gravel budget may be used to offset the cost of the Earl Wade Road culvert replacement project. Mr. Baker informed that ANR agreed the length of the new culvert could be reduced from 40 to 30 feet and the height and width could also be reduced, saving the town about \$2,000.

John Shaw's request to install No Parking signs on Sugar Hill Road, near a pull off often used by hikers accessing the Long Trail, was tabled until Mr. Shaw could provide more details. The board discussed numerous complaints regarding roadside mowing.

Robert and Kathi Aines discussed the odor of garbage, animal manure and burning trash emanating from their neighbor's property. They cannot enjoy the outdoor use of their property due to the odors. ZA Jeff Biasuzzi the state's Air Quality Division and provided their written response. Local zoning regulations and ordinances do not address odors or animal waste. Mr. Biasuzzi will arrange a site visit with the town's health officer.

Gary Wells received permission for the Wallingford Volunteer Fire Department to operate a coin drop on Saturday, October 8 near St. Patrick's Catholic Church on North Main Street.

Mr. Biasuzzi received permission to attend the VT Municipal Day in Montpelier, splitting the cost with the four towns he serves.

The board approved Assessor Lisa Garcia's request to grant the Veteran's tax exemption of \$40,000 to Jim Marquis that was approved by the VA Office on May 26.

N. Tift noted he provided a key to RCD deputy J. Ryan-LeBlanc for the Elfin Lake gate to monitor lake activity now that the beach has closed for the season.

09/19/16. Present: B. Brooks, R. Regula, M. Tessier, and G. Fredette

A half dozen East Street residents asked the Board to consider a consistent policy with regard to dust control on dirt roads. Lee Houghton believes too much material was put on in the winter resulting in excessive dust on the road the rest of the year. He made suggestions to control the dust. The road foreman and road commissioner will be advised of residents' concerns, request for more chloride and the development of a policy.

Kurt Brown expressed concern about water runoff at his mother's property on Maple Street with regard to the Cumberland Farms' renovation project. B. Brooks shared CF's engineering plan to install a catch basin near the top of the road and a culvert and riprap along the northern end of the property.

The board reviewed documents from VT ANR regarding floor drains that discharge to ground surface. This matter was tabled until the Road Commissioner was present.

The Board approved relocating St. Patrick's Church food shelf to the Town Hall if no volunteers come forward to continue running it at the church.

Planning Commission Chair Erika Berner received approval to apply for a Municipal Planning Grant to update the Town Plan.

The board tabled appointment to the Prudential Committee until further questions are answered.

ZA Jeff Biasuzzi indicated that DEC enforcement officer Patrick Lowkes recommended the legal department file a Notice of Violation. Mr. Biasuzzi further reported Health Officer Trish Nash had recommended a course of action in regard to a Sugar Hill Road odor complaint.

B. Brooks expressed his support for the Energy Committee's grant application for a Button Up Workshop and a series of energy audits.

Burn Permits

By State statute, a permit from the Fire Warden is needed for all open fires. Burning of garbage is prohibited by law. For general questions about open burning, please contact Dave Shepard at (802) 272-4088.

The board discussed Years of Service related to benefits/vacation days/time-off for the Town Administrator/Assistant Clerk and approved years of service as 1.5 years.

The board reviewed the 2010 inventory of municipal catch basins. Catch basins will have to be cleaned annually in the future.

The board agreed the Natural Resources Board should email Act 250 notices to the Town Administrator to be forwarded to the Planning Commission.

The board reviewed two estimates for vehicle damage by a gate at the Meadow Street ball field. They will be forwarded to VLCT.

The Board approved signing VEDA's note modification agreement to amend the annual Route 140W bridge loan payment due dates from 7/31 to 9/30.



CONSERVATION COMMISSION

08/22/16. Present: M. Pramuk, D. Scranton, C. Macleod, D. Klock, and R. Nimitz

Stone Carver Kerry Furlani will begin her project soon.

Wildflower planting in front of the split rails fence has grown too high, covering the fence and stone to be carved. Some species of plants may spread rapidly over the Meadow too. Trimming will be done soon.

Marc has three possible locations for up to three bee hives. Priorities are shade in the hot afternoon summer sun, separation from Meadow hikers and easy access for maintenance. Cost for bee colonies will be about \$400.

Debbie donated raspberry bushes that Marc planted. We have located some possible candidates on site to replace dead birch tree at the parking area. Mowing of the meadow was discussed as well as creating a rain garden at the canoe launch. The road crew will be asked to add gravel in east parking area.

Possible speakers for this fall and winter could include: invasive species, foraging, composting, bees, and star gazing.

There is \$1,700 in the budget with \$450 earmarked for bee project, \$300 for brochures, \$550 for stone carving, and \$150 for Winter Fun Day.

Debbie will research property that is for sale near the twin bridges on Route 7. It may be contiguous to Town property and desirable as a project site.

PLANNING COMMISSION

09/12/16. E. Berner, J. Biasuzzi, C. Martin, and J. Burkett

Ed Bove, director of the RRPC, introduced the Municipal Planning Grants available for update work on the Town Plan. The revised Town Plan has to be approved by February, 2018. The present Plan lacks three required components: Designated Village Center (Act 59) criteria; Flood Resilience criteria; and a comprehensive Energy Plan. He identified areas in the review criteria that would improve the review score of an application. The Selectboard has to sign the resolution to submit the application. E. Bernier is to ask S. Switzer's assistance in the application process and to schedule time to discuss with the Selectboard at their 9/19 meeting.

Mr. Bove also discussed available Transportation Grants. The Town has to designate certain Grant management personnel.

The next meeting of the Planning Commission was moved to the first Monday in October on October 3rd.

PRUDENTIAL COMMITTEE.

08/24/16. Present: S. Sendra and K. Stocker

The Board approved pre-buying 1,500 of heating fuel from Champlain Valley.

Maureen reported that she did not find any favorable reviews on drum-style fans for the lodge. She has found 30" pedestal ones would probably work better. Scott and Kandie also researched them, and following some discussion, the Board approved purchasing two large pedestal-style fans plus a smaller one for the stage.

Maureen informed the Board that the Selectboard inquired on the status of filling the vacancy on the Prudential Committee as Bill Brooks is still interested on serving on the Board. Scott has spoken to a couple of people who the Board will interview. There are also a couple more individuals that may have interest. Therefore, the Prudential Committee should have a candidate for the Selectboard's approval.

09/14/16. Present: S. Sendra and K. Stocker

Maureen presented the following purchase requests from the Fire Chief: 1) a low pressure regulator for the air pack system at cost of approximately \$300, and 2) a new refrigerator for the fire house. Approval was given for the two purchases capping the refrigerator cost at \$600.

The board received notice that a resident interested in serving on the Prudential Committee could not commit to Wednesday evening meetings at this time. Charlie Gauthier would like to serve again as his health has improved. The Board agreed to notify the Selectboard that they wish to appoint Charlie Gauthier to fill the vacancy until the next annual meeting in April, 2017.

Scott asked for an update on the Lattuca's past due account on the Hull Avenue property. Maureen has not heard anything since the beginning of August. The Board asked the clerk to send an email stating that it's been long enough time trying to get this resolved and they back the DTC in shutting off the water in October if not paid.

Scott reported that Gary Wells purchased a woodstove for the cabin at Elfin Lake so that he has some heat this winter if power is lost. Gary was told to have the chimneys checked and repaired before installing the woodstove. The Board accepted the bid from Thomas Jones to perform repairs at the cabin and lodge for \$2,800.

The board reviewed and signed off on all the monthly financials.

Maureen updated the Board on SOS's projects and operations. SOS has finished all projects that needed to be finished before winter. Chris Hayes would still like to get the MISSION dialer system installed for alarms to come through at both the water and wastewater locations. The board asked that Chris obtain a quote so they can discuss at another meeting.

PLANNING COMMISSION UPDATES: The Town Planning Commission needs your **RESIDENT PARTICIPATION!** In the next year, the priority is to update the Town Plan. This maintains the Town's eligibility to receive Grants, maintain **Designated Downtown benefits for Property Owners**, and have a Party Status in future Act 250 and Public Service Board reviews such as the siting & screening of future alternative energy projects.

This Town Plan will then result in revised Zoning Ordinances. These will establish local rules for alternative energy projects, resolve a long-standing dispute on the Industrial District Zones, and correct or clarify language in the present zoning ordinance.

Without an adequate number of PC members, this work may not be accomplished in the required time frame. Two more resident members are asked to volunteer **TWO** hours a month to meet and another couple hours of their time to work on the issues at hand. Ideally, one resident from East & South Wallingford Villages would offer town wide representation. 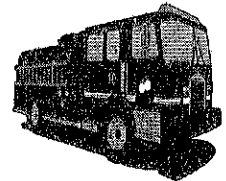

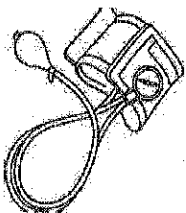

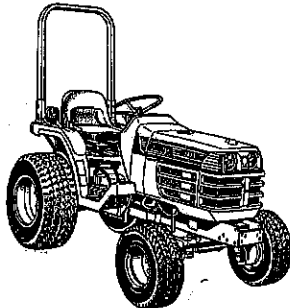

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Dedication-Veterans Memorial Park-Wallingford

In December of 2015, Wallingford American Legion Post #52 was approved to receive a M114A2 Howitzer as a "Conditional Deed of Gift" from the United States Army. Our intent was to make this static display the focus of a memorial to honor the men and women of our military services who courageously served our country and to recognize the loyal support and sacrifices of their families.

Prior to approval, the Army mandated specific requirements for a permanent concrete pad to support the weight (12,800 lbs.) of the cannon and carriage. Due to cold weather conditions, we were unable to meet the requirements and risked losing the opportunity of acquiring the Howitzer. Fortunately, the U.S. Army 424 Engineer Company offered to provide a secure storage location at their Rutland facility. The Army Donations Program subsequently waived the requirement and agreed to the proposal. We then made arrangements to have the Howitzer transported from Baltimore, MD. to Rutland.

In early spring, we were finally able to break ground and go to work. Although the majority of funding for the project was raised by our own members, we could never have achieved our goal without the generous help from local businesses, contractors, and private citizens. The support we received was overwhelming and included donations of material as well as the expertise and operation skilled machine operators.

On October 9th at 2:00 p.m., we will officially dedicate the memorial in Veterans Memorial Park. Post #52 cordially invites all members of the public to join us and honor the service of our veterans and their families. After the ceremony, refreshments will be served in Fellowship Hall at the First Congregational Church. If you have any questions or comments, please contact Tom Truex at 446-3891.
