### It's Time to Register Your Dog for 2017

All dogs, six months of age or older, must be registered annually by April 1<sup>st</sup>. A valid rabies certificate must be submitted, and we're happy to issue licenses through the mail. Fees are \$10 fixed or \$14 not fixed. Contact us at 446-2336.

### Homestead Declaration

Don't forget to file your annual Vt. Dept. of Taxes Homestead Declaration Form HS-122 by April 18. Late filers are charged a penalty. The easiest and quickest way is to file electronically on the Department's website at [www.myVTax.vermont.gov](http://www.myVTax.vermont.gov).

### Property Tax Adjustment

You may be eligible for a property tax adjustment on your 17/18 property taxes if your property qualifies as a homestead and you meet the eligibility requirements. The Property Tax Adjustment Claim Form HS-122 is due April 18. Late filers are charged a late fee.

## MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

*(Please note that these meeting minutes are a brief summary and are not the final approved version.)*

### SELECTBOARD

**2/06/17.** Present: B. Brooks, N. Tift, R. Regula, G. Fredette, and M. Tessier

The board reviewed the East Wallingford Stormwater Infrastructure map and had no changes. Board members agreed to wait until the road commissioner's review was complete before contacting the state regarding a final draft of the map.

The board took no action on J. Biasuzzi's letter regarding the town garage sand pile. Mr. Biasuzzi's letter outlining a number of state road concerns will be forwarded to VTrans.

The Board signed a three-year agreement with Earth Waste for metal recycling.

The board tabled a request from Assessor Lisa Wright regarding the purchase of two Dell tablets until further research on the cost from multiple vendors is obtained.

N. Tift reported on an issue with the Sheriff's dispatcher not hearing the constable's calls. He obtained a quote of \$1,300 for an analog radio or \$2,300 for a digital radio with a \$225 trade-in for the town's radio. M. Tessier said he had a UHF booster that may resolve the problem.

The board directed S. Switzer to seek estimates to install additional outlets and telephone jacks at Town Hall along with wire maintenance.

There was a brief discussion regarding the unregistered vehicles at property on Route 103. A violation letter of the town's junk ordinance will be issued.

S. Switzer and Road Foreman Steve Lanfear will attend a VTrans grant workshop March 2nd.

There was a discussion regarding the Prudential Committee's minutes. A letter will be issued to the Prudential Committee regarding the sidewalk snow removal along Cumberland Farms.

Eileen Tessier is interested in joining the Recreation Committee. She will be asked to send a letter of interest to the Selectboard.

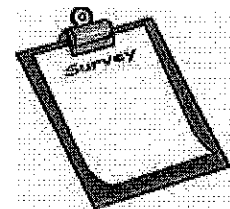
## PLANNING COMMISSION

**2/13/17.** E. Berner, J. Biasuzzi, J. Burkett, K. Mullin, and C. Martin.

E. Smigielski, a Town Plan Specialist from RRPC, was introduced to the PC. She submitted a "concise version" of portions of the present Town Plan, reducing pages of text. She also presented a sample Opinion Survey that could be distributed in March at Town Meeting and on Election Day, and through Survey Monkey, Front Porch Forum and the Wallingford News. The PC discussed focus questions for this Opinion Survey, which Elysa was to incorporate in a draft version, to be emailed to the PC by the next week.

Monday, June 12th was selected as a date for an early evening Town Forum to collect ideas from residents as to the objectives for Wallingford for the next decade. Results of the survey will to be available to discuss at the Forum. E. Berner offered to request use of the Rotary building as it has a kitchen. Grant funds could be utilized to provide "Light Eats" from local businesses. Assistant hosts, in the form of Scouts, Key Clubs, and volunteers would be requested to help with set-up, serving, and clean-up duties. Advertising of the event would include news announcements, street banners, sandwich signs, Wallingford News, Front Porch Forum, and store window announcements.

J. Biasuzzi announced receipt of an application for an illuminated sign for the Citgo convenience store and anticipates at least one other application that would require DRB review.



### Wallingford Community Survey

The Wallingford Planning Commission is updating the town plan. They have created a town survey, as well as picked a date for the community forum. Save the Date for a Wallingford Community Dinner on June 12, 2017. More details to come soon!

**PRUDENTIAL COMMITTEE**

1/25/17. Present: S. Sendra and K. Stocker

Only one bid has been received for the bathroom renovations at the lodge. A notice will be put in the February town newsletter with a new submission deadline of February 8<sup>th</sup>.

Scott explained it was going to be more expensive to have the plow shoes made than it was to order them, so he asked Maureen to place the order. They should be here the first part of next week.

The Fire Department requested purchasing a couple more of the handheld traffic signs as they work very well and are bright at night. The Board approved this purchase.

The board asked Maureen to see if the Fire Chief could attend the next meeting to get an update on how things are going and go over a few things that they would like to see happen.

2/08/17. Present: S. Sendra, K. Stocker, and M. Santor

The Board read a letter from the Selectboard concerning the sidewalk in front of Cumberland Farms. The board agreed that Gary Wells should plow it. Scott was initially upset that the Prudential Committee was not consulted on where the sidewalk should be placed because of our water/sewer lines.

Michael Hughes could not make this meeting so he was asked to attend our next meeting.

Woodline Carpentry was approved to repair the bathroom at the lodge after comparing bids.

The board went through all monthly financials and signed off on them.

Maureen reported on an email from Fire Chief Michael Hughes. One fire truck has a pump issue and the dump valve is not working on another truck. A repair call has been made on the pump issue. Since the dump valve has stuck before and it was repaired in-house, the Board would like that to happen again if possible.

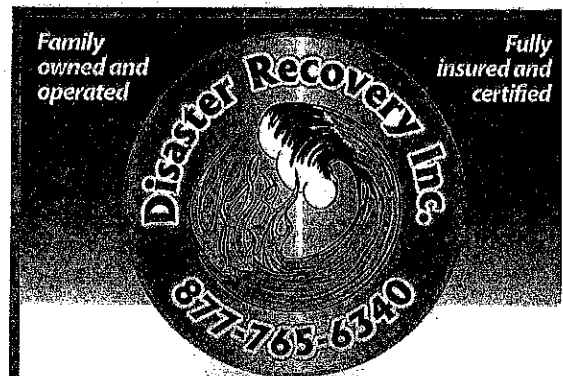

The legal voters of the Town of Wallingford, Vermont are hereby warned and notified to meet at WALLINGFORD ELEMENTARY SCHOOL on Monday evening, March 6, 2017 at 7:00 P.M. to act upon the following articles. The Polls will be open on Tuesday, March 7, 2017 from 10:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. at the WALLINGFORD TOWN HALL for the purpose of voting Australian Ballot.

ARTICLE I. To elect the following Town Officers by Australian Ballot: a **Town Moderator, Grand Juror, Town Agent and First Constable**, each for one-year terms; **two Selectboard members**, one for two years and one for three years; an **Auditor** for three years; a **Lister** for three years; a **Town Clerk and Treasurer** for three years; a **Trustee of Public Funds** for three years; and a **School Director** for Mill River Union Unified School District for three years.

ARTICLE II. Shall the Town vote to have scholarships provided under Title 16 VSA, Section 2535, the same to be applied for on or before April 28, 2017 at the Mill River Unified Union School District Office?

ARTICLE III. Shall the Town vote to have one-half (1/2) of the fiscal year 2018 (July 1, 2017 - June 30, 2018) property taxes and fire protection taxes paid to the Town Treasurer on or before October 16, 2017 at 4:30 P.M. and the remaining one-half of the fiscal year 2018 property taxes and fire protection taxes paid to the Town Treasurer on or before April 16, 2018 at 4:30 P.M.? Payments are physically due in the Town Office; post-marked dates WILL NOT be accepted.

ARTICLE IV. Shall the voters of the Town of Wallingford vote to appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1,077,548 for the General Operation of the town, with an amount not to exceed \$728,492 to be raised in Property Taxes for fiscal year 2018?

ARTICLE V. Shall the Town authorize the Selectboard to borrow money from time to time as may be required?

ARTICLE VI. Shall the Town approve the Reports of the Town Officers as submitted?

ARTICLE VII. Shall the voters authorize the elimination of the Office of Lister and replace it with a professionally qualified assessor appointed by the Selectboard who shall have the same powers, discharge the same duties, proceed in the discharge thereof in the same manner, and be subject to the same liabilities as are prescribed for listers or the board of listers under the provisions of Title 32?

ARTICLE VIII. Shall the voters of the Town of Wallingford approve raising a sum of \$10,000 in property taxes in support of Green Hill Cemetery maintenance?

ARTICLE IX. The School Directors from Mill River Unified Union School District will present information related to the 2017 Mill River Unified Union School District Annual Meeting and the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 education budget for the Mill River Unified Union School District. THIS IS AN INFORMATION ARTICLE ONLY - THE UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT ARTICLES WILL BE DISCUSSED AT THE MILL RIVER UNIFIED UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT ANNUAL MEETING HELD AT 7:00 P.M. ON THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 23, 2017 AT THE MILL RIVER UNION HIGH SCHOOL AUDITORIUM. ARTICLES WILL BE VOTED BY AUSTRALIAN BALLOT ON TUESDAY, MARCH 7.

ARTICLE X. To conduct such other business as may properly come before the meeting.
