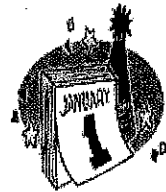

MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

(Please note that these meeting minutes are a brief summary and are not the final approved version.)

SELECTBOARD

5/01/17. Present: B. Brooks, N. Tift, R. Regula, M. Tessier, and G. Fredette

Road Commissioner Phil Baker said the road crew had been grading West Hill Road. He said the grader would likely go in for major repairs next month. Mr. Baker discussed possible summer paving projects. He reported the North End Drive repairs still needed to be done.

The board reviewed VLCT's information regarding amending zoning regulations. There was discussion regarding the documents prepared and submitted by Michael McMahon, a PC member, detailing changes to the zoning regs dating back to 1972 and whether revisions were done following statute. Erika Berner, PC chair, said RRPC Executive Director Ed Bove assured her the regulations were in full compliance with state requirements. She reiterated that the PC is updating the Town Plan, which expires in 2/18. The PC intends to address the industrial zone regulations after the Town Plan is completed.

It was asked if the '15 regs can be repealed and thereby revert to the '09 regs until the Town Plan was completed. The town administrator will do further research and Ed Bove and VLCT to inquire the steps necessary to repeal zoning regulations. The Selectboard tabled the acceptance of the petition until the 5/15 meeting.

Delinquent Tax Collector Lee Perry received approval that the town make the minimum bid if necessary, at next week's tax sales.

The Selectboard discussed AT&T's request to revise the existing cell tower lease at Town Hall. A letter of interest in negotiating a new lease will be sent.

The board planned a site visit for June 14 at 6:00 p.m. with a public hearing to follow at Town Hall on the discontinuance request on Mears Meadow Trail.

The Selectboard approved the hiring of summer employees.

The Selectboard approved utilizing Casella for Food Scrap Collection at the Transfer Station.

The Selectboard authorized donating two Elfin Lake season passes for Bike Safety Day.

G. Fredette would like the town to consider adopting an ordinance allowing 4-wheelers to utilize specific sections of roads that connect trails.

Julie Sharon asked whether she should start a new account for revenue generated from ball field signs.

The board is willing to sell the lister printer to an employee for \$50.

Board members indicated an interest in discussing whether the town should require Certificates of Occupancy after reviewing opposing opinions by the town's assessor and zoning administrator.

There was a discussion regarding drug use activity complaints at the White Rocks picnic area. N. Tift said the Forest Service had a contract with the Rutland County Sheriff's Department and any patrols by the sheriff for that purpose should be billed to the Forest Service.

5/15/17. Present: B. Brooks, N. Tift, R. Regula, M. Tessier, and G. Fredette

After discussions with the AT&T lease consultant via telephone regarding the cell tower lease, the Selectboard made changes to the proposed revised lease and approved lowering the monthly rent to \$1,455 with annual increases of 3%, deleting the expansion of permit use language, reducing a 30-year lease to 15 years, and delaying the amended lease up to one year.

There was discussion regarding the South Wallingford Industrial Zone petition.

Mike McMahon distributed a timeline for zoning bylaw adoptions since 1972 and provided an overview of the adoption process since then, with some bylaws being approved via Australian ballot method and other amendments approved by the Selectboard. RRPC Executive Director Ed Bove provided copies of state statute indicating municipalities must ask voters at Town Meeting or a Special Meeting whether all future bylaws should be adopted by the Australian ballot method. The town never conducted that vote; therefore, the bylaws approved by the Selectboard in 2015 were adopted legally.

B. Brooks said there were zoning map questions pertaining to the areas zoned industrial in all areas of the town. B. Brooks indicated they had received a petition calling for the industrial district to be amended to reflect the 1972 industrial zone. Mr. Bove said language was deleted, during the 2015 zoning amendment process that tied zoning districts to parcels, for the purpose of ensuring districts would not change if property owners purchased or sold land. Mr. Bove suggested the PC and RRPC work on Town Plan updates and amend the zoning map concurrently.

The board chair requested PC Chair Erika Berner provide the Selectboard with regular updates whenever future land use was being discussed. Ms. Berner agreed and noted a June 12 community dinner to gather local input to shape the new Town Plan. Mr. Wheeler agreed to withdraw the petition as long as both RRPC and the town's PC were willing to revise the industrial zones while amending the Town Plan.

Kurt Brown discussed the build-up of silt in the ditch bordering his mother's property on Maple Street. He thought that the road crew was to install a culvert the length of the property from previous discussions. B. Brooks did not recall the board approved that solution. They agreed that the road foreman and road commissioner should visit Maple Street to see what action could be taken on both sides of the road, without the expense of installing a culvert the length of the property.

The Board approved the signing of the VTrans Creek Road paving grant agreement.

In response to a complaint from Mark Barone, the board agreed to install No Thru Traffic signs on Prospect Street to address speed, child safety and increased traffic complaints. Children at Play signs would be installed too if residents purchase the signs. They agreed on a similar request for Village Street (state highway) in East Wallingford if approved by the State. A "no outlet" sign will be installed on Green Hill Lane.

Bryan Cole's request to use the recreation field Sunday afternoons for informal soccer gatherings was approved.

Delta Dental benefits for fulltime town employees were approved for another year.

G. Fredette reported on the results of the town scholarship committee meeting held recently.

Both properties were sold at the May 11 tax sale. B. Brooks was authorized to sign a settlement agreement on Frank Chapman's tax appeal case.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION

4/24/17. Present: M. Pramuk, Deb Scranton, David Klock, Jill Burkett, and R. Nimitz

Alan Betts presentation on climate change was well received.

Winter Fun Day was a good time although anticipated sledding was thwarted by warming temperatures.

We have Peter Upton's hives and equipment as a good start. Additional equipment has been purchased with grant money. We need a small shed or secure box for beekeeping equipment. We are hoping for advice from local beekeepers with a possible guided tour of an operating apiary.

Stone Meadow Trails: Work needed was discussed.

Green Up Day: Put up posters, hang banner, set up at Rotary and Transfer Station.

Beavers have constructed a dam south of the canoe launch and destroying smaller trees along the banks that would stabilize the stream edges in the future. Beavers could be relocated or wire cages installed on bases of trees.

Year-to-date expenses and budget were discussed.

Work day set for Sunday, April 30. Pick up and set bee hives in place.

DEVELOPMENT REVIEW BOARD

3/24/17. Present: W. Brooks, E. Berner, and J. Burkett

The DRB written decision for Paul Thompson #16-39 was amended to reflect that the carport be completed as the owner had requested.

Following deliberative session for Leo & Bonnie Wood #17-03 and MT Associates d/b/a Midway Oil Corp. #17-04, the Board voted to:

Approve the Woods' application to subdivide 6 acres from a 380.5-acre lot owned by D. Edwards, along Ice Bed Road, with access by the private right-of-way on Gilbert Hart Lane; and 2) Continue deliberation on April 10th after members make personal site visits of comparable locations of similar illuminated signs as the DRB is concerned about the level of light and glare from the proposed illuminated sign at Midway Oil Corp. to the immediate neighborhood.

4/10/17. Present: W. Brooks, E. Berner, and J. Burkett
Re: MT Associates d/b/a Midway Oil Corp. #17-04

Following deliberative session, the Board voted to deny the request for an internally illuminated sign and approve a non-illuminated sign of the same design.

The Green Mountain Passport Program was established in 1973 for seniors and disabled veterans.

TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR A PASSPORT YOU MUST BE:

1. A legal resident of Vermont
2. Age 62 or older, or
3. A Veteran of the uniformed services-provide form DD214 or drivers license with indication (after 7/1/13).

Holders of this card are eligible for admission to Vermont state parks (overnight camping and other park fees are excluded).

The cost of this card is \$2.00 - which is a one-time fee. If the card is lost at any time, just go back to your Town Clerk and they will issue a duplicate free of charge (IF they have a copy of your application). Your card never expires!
