### Explanation of Reappraisal Process and Property Inspections

The process of a town-wide appraisal is one of studying current market values for the community, the factors that impact those values, collecting data on all properties, and then applying a "model" for land and building values for the town. Property inspections are a vital component of the process. We collect data during inspections in order to build the model for land and building values, then make adjustments for unique features of individual properties that may impact those values.

Regarding Interior versus Exterior property inspections, we strive to inspect the interior of all properties. It is the right of any taxpayer to refuse an interior inspection by the appraiser, however, we recommend that it is in your best interest to allow this inspection. We do not take photos of interiors of dwellings or other buildings, and we try to be as non-intrusive as possible.

We are gathering data on number of bedrooms and baths, the date of renovation of interior rooms, measurement of interior features like half-story or basement finished areas that sometimes cannot be measured accurately from

the exterior. We are also gathering data on any factors that may impact value negatively such as water in the basement, awkward layout, very dated interior cosmetics, etc. In fairness to other taxpayers who allow interior inspections, we cannot give credit for depreciation issues we cannot verify visually from the exterior of the building.

If you would prefer to schedule an appointment rather than allow us to make a "cold call" to your home during the weeks that we will be working in your neighborhood (we will mail postcards before each section of town is visited), please call the Assessor's office at 446-2974. If your property is vacant land, we typically conduct inspections from the street or main access to the property as well as mapping information available at the town office. If there are specifics to your cant land parcel that you would like to share or if access is restricted or limited, please contact us to schedule an appointment.

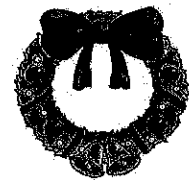

## MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

*(Please note that these meeting minutes are a brief summary and are not the final approved version.)*

## SELECTBOARD

**11/06/17.** Present: B. Brooks, N. Tift, R. Regula, M. Tessier, and G. Fredette

Road Foreman Steve Lanfear reported on repairs being done to West Hill and Dugway Road along with recent equipment repairs.

Frank Beliveau of Innovation Surface Solutions provided an overview of liquid products used on road salt to reduce amounts used and increase effectiveness as well as solutions for dust control measures in the summer.

Planning Commission Chair Erika Berner discussed the PC meetings held regarding the town plan. There was further discussion concerning the draft version of the plan.

The board noted Gene Gilman's resignation as auditor.

The Board approved: the Treasurer accepting credit cards for payments with no cost to the town; applying for a road erosion inventory grant; agreed that the ZA should issue a notice of violation to Carol Witham; approved revised job descriptions for TS attendants; approved selling the Conservation Commission's jars of honey; approved use of the town hall to hold a play, A Christmas Carol, on 12/17; and approved nominating an interim Z.A. for an upcoming DRB hearing as Jeff Biasuzzi has a conflict of interest.

Board members viewed the proposed [www.wallingfordvermont.com](http://www.wallingfordvermont.com) website that is dedicated to local Wallingford businesses. Photographs of Town Hall should not be used on the home page as visitors may be confused into thinking it was the municipal website.

**11/20/17.** Present: B. Brooks, R. Regula, M. Tessier, and G. Fredette

Road Commissioner reported on the finished projects on Dugway and West Hill, along with work done on Hartsboro Road that's prone to flooding. The Van Wyck bridge was discussed as well as the other roads damaged on 7/01.

Capital and Town Government FY'19 budgets were reviewed.

The board noted Michael McMahon's resignation from the Planning Commission.

Justin Jankus was appointed interim Zoning Administrator for an upcoming DRB hearing as Jeff Biasuzzi has a conflict of interest.

A letter of appreciation was signed for Jerry Tift who will not run again for Constable in March.

BCBS and MVP insurance premiums for 2018 were reviewed.

The Selectboard discussed the proposed relocation of the green sign, with the names of five towns, from its present location on the corner of Town Hall property to about 10' east, so it will be right in front of Town Hall. Sandi contacted VTrans to request possible alternatives and met with a VTrans engineer. She was told the new sign will be 6' long, 5' high and the bottom of the sign will be 7' above grade. If the new sign were to be installed in the exact location of the existing sign, the contractor would need to cut down a considerable portion of the tree. The Selectboard opposed relocating the sign.



### PLANNING COMMISSION

10/25/17. Present: E. Berner, K. Mullin, J. Jankus, M. McMahon, and J. Burkett

This was a special "Working Meeting" with the purpose to continue progress on drafting a revised Town Plan with E. Smigielski, RRPC Planner.

E. Berner then opened the meeting for public input: a. Judy & Lynn Edmund submitted a prepared statement. Christopher Dunigan encouraged investment in the Main Village and disclosed he was under contract to purchase 27 N. Main St. (Mom's Diner) and hoped to rent the restaurant to a new operator. He supported the Plans' recommendation for an Economic Development Study. There were several comments submitted on the importance of local zoning. Joyce Barbieri encouraged the PC to utilize the talents and experience of the Town's residents and business owners asking for their opinion and advice whenever a Plan element is being discussed. David Cornwell was told the error in the S Wallingford industrial Zoning District would be revised after the Town Plan is approved.

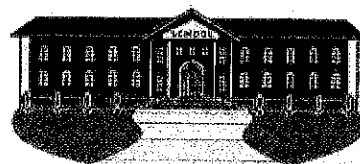

## CONSERVATION COMMITTEE

10/23/17. Present: M. Pramuk, D. Scranton, C. Macleod, R. Nimitz, and J. Burkett

Both bee colonies merged and continue to do well. Kevin Mullin brought a case of jars with 16 full of honey. Marc designed labels to affix to jars. The honey will be sold at the town office for \$5.

Jill mowed the trails to widen them. Carol will get fertilizer spikes for new trees. ANR state biologist, Travis Hart, led a 3-hour walk in Stone Meadow, noting the diversity of habitat. Invasive plants are a problem. Some can be confined in a wooded area, some we can weed and contain like in the bog area and ADA trail. We can apply for grant funding for a 'Forest Management Plan' developed for roughly \$785 which Marc's VCC volunteering may cover, and after which we can develop a 5-10 year plan.

Marc said 2.5 day Vermont Coverts Cooperative Training workshop was excellent.

YTD budget and upcoming expenses were discussed.



In appreciation of David Klock's commitment to the Wallingford Conservation Commission since its founding 14 years ago, a bench was dedicated in Dave's honor in Stone Meadow on Saturday, November 4. A celebration was held in Dave's honor, including the unveiling of the bench plaque, a gift of the first jar of honey produced from the bees in the Meadow, and a picnic with BBQ hot dogs, cider and treats. Dave's bench is on the hill in the southeast corner of the Meadow with a scenic view of the conservation land. It is near a tree dedicated in appreciation of Mark Skakel's contributions to the Town and our Conservation Commission, and joins the bench on the hilltop in the southwest corner honoring Dr. Peter Upton who was a fellow founding member. Thank you, Dave, for all your energy and enthusiasm over the years!

## PRUDENTIAL COMMITTEE

10/23/17. Present: K. Stocker, S. Sendra, and M. Santor

Work on a Conflict of Interest Policy was deferred until a full board was present.

The South Main Pump Station work is coming along but the backboard needs more work.

Maureen reported on the leak (now fixed) that was discovered on the line that feeds the lodge from the main pump house. Chris also discovered that the main meter in the pump house is not working properly and is giving false information. Chris received a few quotes to get this replaced. The Board approved the lowest quote of \$3,400.

Monthly financial statements were reviewed and the board signed off on them.

The Board deferred making a decision on the snow plowing bids until the next meeting. The Board discussed having the tires filled with chloride for the winter to make it easier and more stable to plow the sidewalks. Marty said Mountain View was the cheapest at \$250. The Board approved this issue, and Gary will be asked to make an appointment to have this done.

The quotes for removing a couple of trees are still coming in. This item will be reviewed at the next meeting.

Maureen has performed a 5-year upgrade to the QuickBooks system that covers the software, payroll, and full-time technical team for any issues.

11/13/17. Present: K. Stocker, S. Sendra and M. Santor

The board finished the Conflict of Interest Policy. Maureen will type it up so that it can be read (and adopted) in its final version next month.

The board reviewed snow plowing bids and chose F.A.S. Trucking.

The new meter for the Meadow Street Pump Station will be here this week, and Chris Hayes will get it installed. Jeff Duchesne has almost completed the South Main Pump Station.

Monthly financial statements were reviewed and the board signed off on them.

Martin reported on the contractors who dumped materials from the railroad repair along Lodge Lane. The State was notified and the contractor has removed the materials, repaired and seeded the bank. The Board will review again in the spring to see if any further work needs to be done to the area.

Maureen presented the board with the following wish list from the Fire Department: 1) 3-AED pads as the old ones are about to expire; 2) new batteries for Engine 1 as they have never been replaced; 3) 2-stop/slow LED signs for traffic control; and 4) wool socks to have at the station for cold/wet weather. The Board approved everything with the exception of the socks.

Maureen stated that the second meeting next month falls on Christmas. The Board agreed to only meet once in December on the 11<sup>th</sup>.



Wallingford Transfer Station is now accepting food scraps in accordance with the third phase of Act 148 that requires Transfer Stations to accept food scraps from businesses and residents. Items that are accepted as food waste include:

Fruit and veggie (please remove PLU's!!); Bread; Rice; Pasta; Meat and Fish; Bones; Shellfish; Egg shells; Coffee grounds; Coffee filters; Tea bags; Cooking oils and fats; Dairy products (includes cheese, yogurt, eggs); BROWN paper napkins and paper towels.

The most efficient and stink proof way to store your food scraps are in a kitchen scrapper. They are available for purchase at the office located at 2 Smith Lane, Rutland, Vermont. You could also store them in a plastic bag inside of a paper bag and keep it in a cool place like under your sink or in your garage. Please do not include plastic bag in food waste tote.
