Property Tax bills were mailed out on August 23rd. Vermont law states that property owners whose home meets the definition of a Vermont homestead must file a Homestead Declaration annually with the Vt. Dept. of Taxes by the April filing deadline. If eligible, it is important that you file so that you are correctly assessed the homestead tax rate on your property tax bill.

Also if eligible, property owners need to file a claim to receive an adjustment to property taxes. This is required even if you do not have to file or pay state income taxes. Claims for Property Tax Adjustments are due by the April filing deadline. Those who file late must pay a \$15 late filing fee, which will be deducted from the Property Tax Adjustment. Claims filed after Oct. 15 or incomplete claims will not be accepted.

Please contact the Vt. Dept. of Taxes at 802-828-2505 if you have any questions concerning the above.

If you filed a Homestead Form HS-122, please check your tax bill carefully to make sure that you received the state payment.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECT ROUTE 140E

VTrans is still conducting a slope remediation project along Route 140E. Below is their update as of 8/23:

WIRE MESH: Wire mesh installation over the completed nail section began this week and will be ongoing for the next few weeks. A one-lane alternating traffic pattern remains in place. Minor delays can be expected.

LABOR DAY HOLIDAY: Crews will be off of the roadway by noon on Friday, 8/31 in observance of the Labor Day holiday. Work will resume on Tuesday, 9/4 at 7:00 AM.

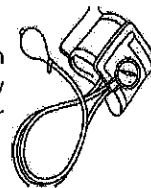

Backyard Woods Program

A course for Vermont homeowners interested in caring for their woods

- Do you own less than 25 acres?
- Are you interested in becoming a more active steward of your woods?

Then you may be interested in the Backyard Woods Program!

The Backyard Woods Program is an online course targeted at teaching homeowners with 25 acres or less about their woods and how they can be caretakers of it! *Whether you own 2 acres or 20 acres, this program will help you make the most out of the woods in your backyard!*

Course Details:

- The online course starts Sept. 24 and runs through Nov. 3.
- Participants will also be invited to an in-person Backyard Woods field walk (TBD).
- This course is composed of 4 online sections. Each section has videos, webinars, and activities aimed at helping you develop a stewardship action plan with a project schedule.

Self-Paced: This online course is self-paced and all activities are to be completed on your own schedule during the course, with the exception of the live webinars and in-person walks. The course schedule is intended to keep you on track to complete the course in 6 weeks. This flexibility allows you to complete all activities and watch videos when you have time each week. You can expect to spend 1.5-3 hours each week on the course.

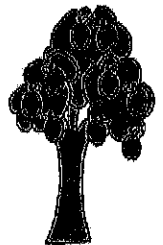
Paddle 4 Paws

Selectboard Meeting Actions:

8/06: Approved assessment of penalties as outlined by the State for late filings of Homestead Declaration; set the Municipal Tax Rate at \$0.3508, an increase of 3.5 cents based on FY'19 budget current property taxes of \$797,121.84 plus \$2,079 for the Rutland Marketing Initiative approved by voters and the FY'18 net loss of \$2,835.43. The state calculates the education rates; accepted Champlain Valley Heating's low bid of \$2.55/gallon; directed the town administrator to issue municipal tickets to Ken Generess of Prospect Street for violation of the municipal ordinance regulating the outdoor storage of junk and junk vehicles; approved Ryan Carr's request to allow 11 Green Mountain College students and 3 trip leaders to camp at Stone Meadow for one night in August; approved a \$65 refund to Melissa Baker for an Elfin Lake season pass after her two daughters refused to return to the lake after witnessing two men strip out of wet clothes on the beach; approved Michel Lapointe of VT USDANRCS's recommendation to change eligibility determination to "not eligible" for USDANRCS funds to allow FEMA funds to kick in for the July 1, 2017 storm; agreed vehicle stickers for the transfer station should not be included in this year's tax bills, but continue to distribute to new property owners with the "welcome letter"; and heard an update on Dennis Smith's Church Street property junk and/or junk vehicles.

8/20: Agreed there is no town issue with the set of mailboxes at 960-968 West Hill Road; heard report from Road Commissioner Phil Baker including a new truck for the town and purchasing Mr. Baker's sander; painting lines on roads as well as crosswalks; reviewed the investment report and financial management questionnaire submitted by Town Clerk and Treasurer Julie Sharon; authorized Nelson Tift to serve as voting delegate at the VLCT annual fair in October; with Rose Regula and Sandi Switzer attending as well; nominated Maria French as the town's delegate to attend the VCRD Leadership Conference in October at Castleton University with B. Brooks too; Katherine Maclauchlan could also attend too; changed 9/3 meeting to 9/4; and approved a catering permit for 9/08 wedding at the Barns at White Rocks.

Recreation Committee Actions:

Recommend Carolyn Behrendt's appointment to committee to replace Susan Taggart who resigned. Trisha Nash resigned as well.

Summer Recreation Co-directors will be invited to report on summer program.

Maintenance for the playground, basketball court, dug outs and fields were discussed.

Committee will work on bylaw updates.

The Committee wants to hire a full time Recreation Director at \$50,000 (\$35,000 base salary and \$15,000 in approximate benefits) to increase the desirability of our town, moving our community forward and attracting new families to our area, which will bring new taxpayers and increase the economic impact of Wallingford.

Planning Commission: No meetings in July and August.

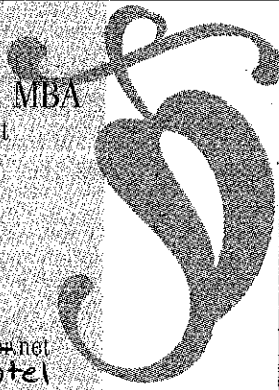

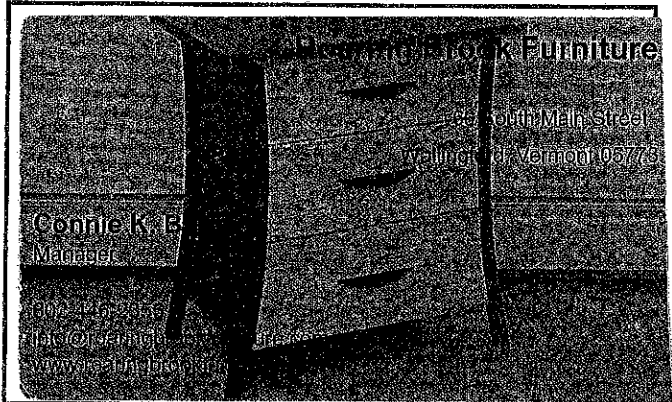


