


It's Time to Register Your Dog for 2017
 All dogs, six months of age or older, must be registered annually by April 1st. A valid rabies certificate must be submitted, and we're happy to issue licenses through the mail. Fees are \$10 fixed or \$14 not fixed. Contact us at 446-2336.

Homestead Declaration
 Don't forget to file your annual Vt. Dept. of Taxes Homestead Declaration Form HS-122 by April 18. Late filers are charged a penalty. The easiest and quickest way is to file electronically on the Department's website at www.myVTax.vermont.gov.

Property Tax Adjustment
 You may be eligible for a property tax adjustment on your 17/18 property taxes if your property qualifies as a homestead and you meet the eligibility requirements. The Property Tax Adjustment Claim Form HS-122 is due April 18. Late filers are charged a late fee.

MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

(Please note that these meeting minutes are a brief summary and are not the final approved version.)

SELECTBOARD

1/02/17. Present: N. Tift, R. Regula, G. Fredette, and M. Tessier

Wallingford Fire Chief Michael Hughes informed the board he was investigating a matter raised in James Driscoll's letter to the town that did not involve the town in any manner.

The Selectboard appointed Martin Santor to the Prudential Committee.

Action on the FY'18 Administration, Insurance, and Revenue budgets were tabled until the full board was present.

The Selectboard approved signing the VT AOT's Finance and Maintenance Agreement for grade crossing improvements on Route 140W.

The Selectboard approved a request by Rutland Co. Solid Waste District to add an article to the Town Warning amending the charter to feature a one vote per town clause.

The new Transfer Station sticker design was approved. G. Fredette explained the purpose of the stickers was to ensure only legal residents utilized the facility. One sticker will be sent with each property tax bill; extra stickers can be bought at Town Hall for \$3 each. The sticker requirement will begin September 1st.

The Selectboard approved budgeting \$2,500 to the FY'18 budget towards the purchase of a flashing Radar Speed sign to be installed on upper School Street. The MRUUSD Board included \$2,500 in their budget and a citizen is donating \$1,000.

Zoning Administrator Biasuzzi presented an overview of the zoning budget, his salary request, and stipends for the planning commission and Development Review Board.

1/09/17. Present: B. Brooks, N. Tift, R. Regula, G. Fredette, and M. Tessier

The FY'18 Administration, Insurance and Revenues budget were approved.

G. Fredette noted there were a lot of vehicles at the O'Connell (Agostinelli) residence on Route 103. S. Switzer responded she had requested the constable verify how many vehicles were registered.

S. Switzer informed the board of the January 11 tax sales at Town Hall, and the Selectboard approved bidding on the Route 103 Witham property if there were no other bidders.

The board discussed Jeff Biasuzzi's request to budget stipends for the Planning Commission and DRB members. Board members expressed concerns it would set a precedent for members of all municipal groups to receive stipends and agreed to offer 20-punch transfer station cards instead.

Planning Commission Chair Erika Berner gave an update regarding amending the South Wallingford industrial zone. RRPC's Ed Bove advised a South Wallingford resident to send a written request to the commission outlining what he would like changed in the zoning supported by reasons for the change. The PC is currently updating the Town Plan and would revisit zoning regulations to make any adjustments necessary to align zoning with the revised plan.

S. Switzer notified the board Rutland Co Solid Waste District rescinded its request to place an Article on the Town Meeting ballot with a one vote per town charter change.

1/16/17. Present: B. Brooks, N. Tift, R. Regula, G. Fredette, and M. Tessier

The Selectboard signed the annual state Certificate of Highway Miles with no changes.

The board discussed a response to state transportation officials regarding rail crossing improvements for Route 140W this year and next.

The board adopted a proposed FY'18 budget of \$1,077,548 with \$728,492 to be raised in taxes.

Second quarter financials were reviewed.

Revisions to the Employee Handbook were reviewed and approved.

The Selectboard discussed the sidewalk in front of Cumberland Farms.

A Building Use Request was approved for an exercise group at a cost of \$1 per attendee.

The Selectboard approved the town meeting warning, after review with Jay Kenlan.

The board directed the Town Administrator to respond to Gloria Werle regarding her complaint about the delinquent tax collector.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION
No meeting held in December & January.

PLANNING COMMISSION

12/12/16. E. Berner, J. Biasuzzi, J. Burkett, and C. Martin

Jeff discussed proposed stipends for FY'18 budget purposes, referring to other towns' stipends. He will prepare the proposed budget for the 1/2 Selectboard meeting.

Erika reported that the Town received a grant for the town plan for \$7,995. She will discuss the procedures with RRPC Ed Bove; RRPC will be the consultant on the plan preparation and adoption process.

1/09/17. E. Berner, J. Biasuzzi, J. Burkett and K. Mullin

E. Smigielski, a Town Plan Specialist from RRPC, was introduced to the PC. She described her planning expertise in drafting compliant Town Plans. Part of the updated Town Plan format addresses the Village Center Designation which needs greater promotion. E. Smigielski will bring a draft sample of the Wallingford Town Plan, written in a condensed format to the February meeting.

The next objective is to schedule a late Spring Forum where public can gather to discuss key issues for the Town. A Public Survey questionnaire should be prepared and distributed as soon as possible (and at Town Meeting), so that opinion results can be reported at the Forum.

E. Berner recently updated the Selectboard on the plan to update the Industrial Zoning District in S. Wallingford. As discussed several time in the past six months, the Town Plan update has priority, followed by a revised zoning adoption that applies new Town Plan objectives.

K. Mullin reported on the Act 174 (Siting & Screening) training seminar held at RRPC. One main "take off" is to use directive language ("shall or must") in the Plan and regulations. RPC's have to issue their mandated Energy plans in early 2017. These Plans have to prove to be "practical, do-able, and enforceable."

PRUDENTIAL COMMITTEE

12/28/16. Present: S. Sendra and K. Stocker

Martin Santor attended as he may be interested in the vacancy on the Prudential Committee.

The board reviewed the General Checking account financial statement as it was not completed at the last meeting and signed off on it. Maureen reported that the blow-off letters have been mailed.

The Fire Protection Budget Committee will meet on January 12th.

Maureen reported that the Jaws of Life needs to be inspected and certified at an approximate cost of \$600. At the request of the fire department, the Committee approved purchasing six emergency fire blankets for the trucks to replace the worn-out blankets.

The fire department also requested the purchase of a generator to operate the fire house in the event of a long power outage. As this is a large dollar amount purchase, more information was requested.

The Lodge budget will be discussed on February 22nd, the General Budget on March 8th, and the Water/Sewer Budget March 16th.

1/11/17. Present: S. Sendra, K. Stocker, and M. Santor

Maureen reported that the blow offs are all on now until the middle of March.

The Selectboard appointed Martin Santor to the Prudential Committee.

There was discussion about plowing the sidewalk in front of Cumberland Farm. Scott stated that this was something they wanted to avoid as now the main water line is under the sidewalk so if we need to get to the valve, we will have to rip up the sidewalk. CF should have asked the Prudential Committee to either move the shut off or move the sidewalk back a little. The Town and VT AOT are co-owners for the maintenance of that sidewalk. Since there is no place to put the snow except back into the road or into the parking lot, the Committee voted against plowing the sidewalk.

The board signed off on all monthly financials.

Maureen reviewed the first six month financials along with the estimate for the remaining FY. The Committee voted to keep water/sewer rates the same.

The board reviewed the fire protection budget numbers line by line with Martin as he will attend his first budget

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meeting tomorrow evening.

The board read and approved the Fire Chief's report for the town report.

The shoes on the bottom of the plow have broken off. Martin has one of the shafts and has researched how they should be made more durable. He had some photos showing the shape and thickness. Wayne Jones will fabricate a pair.

Maureen presented a bid received for the bathroom floor at the lodge. The board agreed to seek additional bids.

The Committee went into executive session to discuss a personnel issue.

The legal voters of the Town of Wallingford, Vermont are hereby warned and notified to meet at WALLINGFORD ELEMENTARY SCHOOL on Monday evening, March 6, 2017 at 7:00 P.M. to act upon the following articles. The Polls will be open on Tuesday, March 7, 2017 from 10:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. at the WALLINGFORD TOWN HALL for the purpose of voting Australian Ballot.

ARTICLE I. To elect the following Town Officers by Australian Ballot: a **Town Moderator, Grand Juror, Town Agent and First Constable**, each for one-year terms; **two Selectboard members**, one for two years and one for three years; an **Auditor** for three years; a **Lister** for three years; a **Town Clerk and Treasurer** for three years; a **Trustee of Public Funds** for three years; and a **School Director** for Mill River Union Unified School District for three years.

ARTICLE II. Shall the Town vote to have scholarships provided under Title 16 VSA, Section 2535, the same to be applied for on or before April 28, 2017 at the Mill River Unified Union School District Office?

ARTICLE III. Shall the Town vote to have one-half (1/2) of the fiscal year 2018 (July 1, 2017 - June 30, 2018) property taxes and fire protection taxes paid to the Town Treasurer on or before October 16, 2017 at 4:30 P.M.

and the remaining one-half of the fiscal year 2018 property taxes and fire protection taxes paid to the Town Treasurer on or before April 16, 2018 at 4:30 P.M.? Payments are physically due in the Town Office; post-marked dates WILL NOT be accepted.

ARTICLE IV. Shall the voters of the Town of Wallingford vote to appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1,077,548 for the General Operation of the town, with an amount not to exceed \$728,492 to be raised in Property Taxes for fiscal year 2018?

ARTICLE V. Shall the Town authorize the Selectboard to borrow money from time to time as may be required?

ARTICLE VI. Shall the Town approve the Reports of the Town Officers as submitted?

ARTICLE VII. Shall the voters authorize the elimination of the Office of Lister and replace it with a professionally qualified assessor appointed by the Selectboard who shall have the same powers, discharge the same duties, proceed in the discharge thereof in the same manner, and be subject to the same liabilities as are prescribed for listers or the board of listers under the provisions of Title 32?

ARTICLE VIII. Shall the voters of the Town of Wallingford approve raising a sum of \$10,000 in property taxes in support of Green Hill Cemetery maintenance?

ARTICLE IX. The School Directors from Mill River Unified Union School District will present information related to the 2017 Mill River Unified Union School District Annual Meeting and the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 education budget for the Mill River Unified Union School District. THIS IS AN INFORMATION ARTICLE ONLY - THE UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT ARTICLES WILL BE DISCUSSED AT THE MILL RIVER UNIFIED UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT ANNUAL MEETING HELD AT 7:00 P.M. ON THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 23, 2017 AT THE MILL RIVER UNION HIGH SCHOOL AUDITORIUM. ARTICLES WILL BE VOTED BY AUSTRALIAN BALLOT ON TUESDAY, MARCH 7.

ARTICLE X. To conduct such other business as may properly come before the meeting.

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**Annual Meeting of the Mill River Unified Union School District
Towns of Clarendon, Shrewsbury, Tinmouth and Wallingford
February 23, 2017**

The legal voters of the Mill River Unified Union School District are hereby warned to meet at the Auditorium of the Mill River Union High School in Clarendon, Vermont, on February 23, 2017, at 7:00 p.m. for the annual school district meeting to transact the following business:

- ARTICLE 1** To elect the following officers: a. Moderator; b. Clerk; c. Treasurer.
- ARTICLE 2** To authorize the Board of School Directors to borrow money pending receipt of payment from district towns by the issuance of notes or orders payable not later than one year from date.
- ARTICLE 3** To have presented by the Board of School Directors their estimate of the expenses for the ensuing year. This is a public informational hearing regarding the budget article. (See Article 7).
- ARTICLE 4** To act on the reports of the school district officers and directors.
- ARTICLE 5** Shall the voters of the Mill River Unified Union School District approve the Board to expend, \$16,466,704, which is the amount the school board has determined to be necessary for the ensuing fiscal year? (By Australian Ballot) It is estimated that this proposed budget, if approved, will result in education spending of \$16,047.24 per equalized pupil. This projected spending per equalized pupil is 2.77% higher than spending for the current year.
- ARTICLE 6** Shall the voters of the District approve to appropriate the sum of \$50,000 for a building sinking fund? (By Australian Ballot)
- ARTICLE 7** Shall the voters authorize the District to transfer the audited unanticipated surplus funds remaining at the end of FY17 to a building sinking fund, not to exceed \$100,000? (By Australian Ballot)
- ARTICLE 8** To transact any other business that may lawfully come before the meeting.

The meeting will then be recessed to March 7, 2017 (Town Meeting Day) for the purpose of voting by Australian ballot at the usual polling places in the District towns on the following business. Said ballots shall be brought to the Mill River Union High School Cafeteria following the closing of the polls in the District towns where they will be commingled and counted by the officers of the District towns.
