VT Dept. of Taxes Acting Commissioner Craig Bolio set Wallingford's Homestead Education Tax rate at \$1.5279*, an increase of .1836 cents, and the Non-Homestead Education Tax rate at \$1.5455, an increase of .0932 cents.

*We were notified in February 2019 that the Dept. of Taxes made an error in calculating the town's homestead education tax rate. We were one of two towns who had undergone a reappraisal and were in Act 46 incentive districts. They undercharged us \$90,000, and our rate should have been \$1.4115. They decided not to recoup it from the Town and waived the uncollected tax. This is the reason for the large increase in one year.





Selectboard Meeting Highlights

07/01: The Board approved: the roadside mower rental; the Wallingford Block agreement; amended ordinance for no parking in front of Cumberland Farms; 7/13 Rotary coin drop; two Town Hall building use requests; and the Town Hall cleaning contract with F. Davenport. The road crew will fix drainage issues on Nash Drive; regrade Seward Hill Road and have Pike repave the apron; clean drains on Meacham Street; and trim overgrown trees along East Street. A discussion was held with Town Clerk G. Fallar regarding the town line.

07/15: The Board held executive session to discuss a new assessor contract and the Road Foreman evaluation. They approved the Town's Roads and Bridge Standards; hired Phil Baker & Sons for roadside mowing; declined to enter into the Solar Subscription Agreement with Thomas Hand; approved Wallingford Day events; the annual financial management questionnaire; reviewed the semi-annual investment report and preliminary year-end financial results. Zoning updates in regards to South Wallingford rezoning were discussed with two PC members and the Board hired new Recreation Director Jamie Therriault.



