



Wallingford Town Hall Concert Series

Wednesday, November 13th – Woodchuck's Revisited brings together as a quartet two well-known duos from Rutland County, *Woodchucks' Revenge* (Peter and Kristina Cady) and *Heron Fire* (Jon and Peggy Rishel). Both groups have been presenting their brand of music and humor for over 25 years. *Woodchucks' Revenge* has performed all around New England, upstate NY and occasionally in the Rocky Mountain states. *Heron Fire's* appearances run from the Adirondack Mountains into central NY, through the Pioneer Valley of western MA, out to the Cape and into southern New England. The concert will feature two guitars, fiddle and percussion. Their songs range from the Herons' favorite old light pop and folk standards to the Woodchucks' old and new western and Celtic ballads, to some of each group's (usually) tasteful parodies. The audience will enjoy humor, history and the variety of traditions that make up the American music scene -including folk, country, pop and comedy material. Snowplowing Reminders

Reminder — **Winter Parking Ban in effect November 15 through March 31.** No parking allowed on Wallingford roads between the hours of 11 p.m. and 7 a.m.

It is unlawful to plow snow across a town highway or street in a way that leaves snow in the roadway. Violation of this law may result in a \$100.00 fine plus the actual costs of repairing any damage resulting from such obstruction of the highway. (Title 19 V.S.A. 1105)

It is unlawful to cause water or ice to run onto a town highway or street in such a way that it causes damage to the highway or street, obstructs traffic, or creates unsafe conditions. (Title 19 V.S.A. 1111)

The Town of Wallingford is not responsible for vegetation, structures, fences, or mailboxes within town highway rights-of-way damaged during snowplowing. (Title 19 V.S.A. 904, 1111)

Selectboard Meeting Highlights

09/23: Road Commissioner Baker reported on the Van Wyck Bridge repairs, status of road grading, and a complaint regarding the second access through East Street to Van Wyck Road during the bridge repair. Road Foreman Lanfear will attend the 10/22 required training related to Reasonable Suspicion Testing. Wood chips will be delivered to the rec playground. There was a lengthy discussion of the GMNF's acquisition of 481 acres of the Fernfield Farm property on Hartsboro Rd. Town Administrator Switzer reported on the status of the town line dispute on West Hill Road.

Emergency Management Director Tessier was contacted regarding loss of telephone service in the event of a power outage. He suggested the Town consider an ordinance establishing requirements for utilities installing poles and wires in the Town ROW.

The Board approved Collaboration 133 upgrading the municipal website to feature online registration with relative payments for recreation programs; accepted Justin Jankus' resignation from the Planning Commission; agreed to invite Fire Chief Michael Hughes to visit the town garage to make safety recommendations; approved the Emergency Action Plan; recommended the state appoint Mark Barone as fire warden; requested VTtrans make road repairs to the Hull Ave & Rte 7 intersection.

N. Tift said he authorized Vermont Digital to make repairs/updates to the zoning administrator computer. There was discussion about overtime with the highway department.

10/07: Road Commissioner Baker reported on the Van Wyck Bridge repairs, road grading update and the stockpiling of winter sand. The Board discussed the ROW for the Hartsboro Road ditching project; approved the purchase of a 2019 Caterpillar 926M loader; approved DTC Teer's request to take properties to tax sale; approved the Town Clerk's new Record Management Policy; approved zoning workshop training and computer security awareness webinar; approved Attorney Merriman petitioning the court for a judgment on the town line dispute; approved the Hazardous Communication Program as well as misc. items needed for the town garage; reviewed and approved VLCT's property insurance renewal docs; and discussed the excess water on Meadow Street. 1st quarter financials were reviewed, and there was more discussion on the GMNF's acquisition of 481 acres of the Fernfield Farm property on Hartsboro Rd. Cecile Betit spoke on backup power for telephone service in the event of power outages.

10/21: Road Commissioner Baker reported the Van Wyck Bridge project is complete. The Board approved the financing for the loader purchase; discussed the highway debris off of Tift Road; reviewed the Fire Chief's inspection of the Town Garage and his safety recommendations; approved 2019-20 snowplowing of the elementary school's parking lot; and discussed the recommendation to not allow the use of TS cards for metal and construction debris payment. Former DTC Lee Perry explained the balance in his DTC checking account and will meet with J. Sharon to report where these monies belong. Levi Balestra asked the Board to contact the utility company(s) and request they remove their old poles along Route 7. He also discussed the ditch along his mother's property that borders Maple Street. The Board approved the use of the building for a line dancing class sponsored by the Recreation Committee, as well as training for the DTC.





