#### COVID-19

- The Town is accepting registrations with deposits for the Summer Recreation program running the weeks of July 27, August 3 and August 10. All deposits will be returned if the program is cancelled. A decision will be made soon whether the program will move forward this summer.

- The SB will be meeting June 1 to review and/or approve a COVID-19 Control Plan as mandated by the state to possibly reopen Town Hall as early as the first week of June. The Control Plan features requirements for visitors, including mandatory face masks, use of hand sanitizers, safe distancing practices, appointments for researchers, and a limit on the total number of people (employees and visitors) inside Town Hall at any one time. And of course, anyone feeling ill or those who have been exposed to COVID-19 or those who have been in close contact to anyone with the virus are not allowed in the building. People from out of state must have completed a 14-day quarantine before entering the building. Those municipal employees whose jobs allow them to work remotely will continue to do so.

- Elfin Lake will NOT be open to the public this year per orders of the Selectboard on May 4, 2020. There will be NO lifeguards, concessions or public restrooms.

- The Great Elfin Lake 5K race has been cancelled for this summer.

Please limit Wallingford Transfer Station use to essential visits and materials only. Essential materials include: trash, zero sort recycling, metal, electronics, and food scraps. This will help keep traffic moving and enable us to continue to provide these important services.

- Please remember that transfer station staff are not required to assist in unloading your materials. They will practice social distancing for their and your safety.

- If you're feeling under the weather, we ask that you stay home and visit our facility when you are feeling better. This helps protect our workers and other customers.




## GILBERT HART LIBRARY by Wendy Savery

Wallingford Day 2020 is going to look very different from 2019. State directives on summer events and gatherings appear to be evolving from week to week and we need to be ready for restrictions to be put back in place if there is a virus flareup. We've decided that while it's prudent for us to postpone a town wide gathering until next summer, it is very important for us to work on alternative ways to celebrate our town on that day and bring our residents together in spirit, if not in person. By early/mid June we will have a plan in place and will share it with you via Front Porch Forum, the Wallingford Day Facebook page, and this newsletter. Thank you to those who check in on our progress, encourage us, and who have donated time and/or money to Wallingford Day.

Congratulations Good Citizens! The Good Citizen Challenge put Vermont kids to the test. The friendly civics competition designed by Seven Days/Kids VT aims to help kids learn about government and prompt them to become more involved in their communities. Students in grades K-12 complete a variety of civic-themed activities. The challenge was organized by Seven Days and Kids VT, with support from the Vermont Community Foundation. Concerned about composting and not sure what to do about it? As of July 1, 2020, Vermonters will be required to divert their food scraps from the trash. So our team is hosting virtual workshops to discuss the ins and outs of backyard composting as well as other options residents have. The workshop is designed to inform folks on new ways of thinking about our 'wasted' food. Whether you are composting for the first time or an experienced gardener, you'll be sure to walk away with a few new tips and tricks. ### **Selectboard Meeting Highlights**

05/04. Town Administrator Sandi Switzer said the state required all employers to adopt a COVID-19 Control Plan before reopening. Summer Recreation Program Co-Director Lisa Cotrupi recommended cancelling the first week of the 4- week program and tentatively planning for the weeks of 7/27, 8/3 & 8/10. The Board agreed to accept Summer Recreation Program registrations and deposits until Covid-19 related matters for the program are resolved.

The Selectboard appointed Joseph Elwell as the animal control officer; adopted a new Zoning Fee Schedule; approved a liquor license for the Victorian Inn; approved reimbursing S. Lanfear for certain insurance costs; agreed with cancelling the Memorial Day parade; agreed not to open Elfin Lake this summer; agreed not to make any decisions regarding use of bike trails at Stone Meadow until a public survey was taken, a public hearing to gather input was held, and a draft trail plan was submitted; approved the road crew delivering shurpak to Stone Meadow; declined to take action of requiring the public to wear face masks at the Transfer Station; agreed that on June 30<sup>th</sup>, there will be no carryover of any unspent budgeted funds by any Committees/Commissions this year; and reluctantly accepted Marc Pramuk's resignation from the Conservation Commission if he wasn't willing to reconsider.

Road Commissioner Phil Baker discussed the broken branch caught up in trees over Tiff Road; the road projects that are on hold; overhanging trees in the Pembroke Lane neighborhood and a plugged culvert on Nottingham Drive; the parking issue along White Rocks Picnic Road while the gates to the parking area are closed; and the Better Roads grant project on Hartsboro Road.

05/18. There was considerable discussion regarding use of the rec fields and elfin lake as well as the summer rec program under the state's COVID-19 requirements. Kelly DiIunno reported that the Great Elfin Lake 5k event has been cancelled. Road Commissioner P. Baker reported that the new excavator arrived and was used for the Hartsboro Road ditching project; he will develop a priority list for paving projects; and a grant application was submitted for the bridge at the intersection of River, Maple and Creek. Shannon Pytlik was asked to submit information on the areas of erosion along Otter Creek to the Town Administrator as it relates to the 15' riparian forest buffer suggested by Steve Pytlik that would be impacted by mowing.

The Selectboard approved the Conservation Commission's survey for Stone Meadow for June's newsletter; agreed that the Clerk should continue approving vendor permits; agreed to reduce mowing at Elfin Lake; renewed dental insurance coverage; deferred requests for tax abatements to the Board of Abatement regarding the new legislation bill S.344.; deferred discussion about what to do with unspent budgets to the next meeting; appointed Erika Berner and Ken Fredette to the Regional Transportation Council and Tabitha Davis to the Rec Committee; approved installing a water spigot at the rec field; deferred discussion of the energy audit report of Town Hall until the next meeting; and directed the town administrator to provide Attorney Charles Merriman with feedback regarding the Memorandum of Understanding.

## GREEN UP DAY

Green Up Day is now May 30th. Members of the Wallingford Conservation Commission will be at the Gilbert Hart Library from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. for participant sign-up and distribution of Green Up bags. Please come join us in cleaning up our Town. It's looking a little "trashy". Although there will be two WCC members at the library to answer questions, this will essentially be a self-service operation. If 6' social distancing and masks are still required, participants will have to wear masks and remain at least 6' apart.

If anyone wishes to get Green Up bags earlier or later than May 30th, please call Carol Macleod at 446-4658, and we can arrange for pick up of bags and sign-up. When you make your selection of your clean-up area, remember that the Elementary School is not Greening up the downtown area. The Wallingford Transfer Station is not accepting tires or construction materials (wood) at this moment.

### GREEN UP VERMONT SAFETY TIPS:

- \*Wear rugged work gloves.
- \*Wear long pants and boots.
- \*Always check for ticks and, if possible, wear a tick repellent.
- \*Do not pick up sharp objects. Get an adult.
- \*Dispose of any sharp objects in a heavy plastic bottle with lid screwed back on and marked "do not recycle."
- \*Wear bright colored clothing.
- \*Review safety rules with kids.
- \*Work facing oncoming traffic.
- \*Use sunscreen.




