PROPERTY TAX BILLS

Property tax bills should be mailed out by the end of the month. The first half is due by Monday, October 19th at 4:30 p.m. and the second half is due by Monday, April 19th at 4:30 p.m.

COMPOSTABLE BAGS

The Wallingford Transfer Station accepts residential food scraps. Compostable bags for kitchen food scrap collectors are sold at the Transfer Station and at the Town Clerk's Office at a cost of \$4 for a box of 25 of the 3-gallon bags.

FREE FACE MASKS

The Town of Wallingford has a free supply of face masks for residents having difficulty obtaining personal protective equipment. Face masks may be picked up at Town Hall located at 75 School Street. Please note, distribution is limited to one face mask per person. You can call 446-2336 or email: townclerk@wallingfordvt.com to make arrangements to pick up your face mask.

November General Election—Tuesday, 11-3: A ballot will be mailed in late September to every "active" voter on the statewide voter checklist starting Friday, September 18. "Active" voters are any voters that have not been sent a challenge letter by the Board of Civil Authority asking the voter to affirm their residency.

You do not need to request one from us, unless you register to vote after that date.

We will still conduct the election if you wish to come in and vote. You will be required to sign an affidavit that you have not previously returned the ballot sent to you or cast any other ballot.

Postage for the mailing of ballots and the return of ballots by voters will be paid by the Secretary of State's office. All envelopes will be pre-paid.

The ballot will also contain, on the reverse, the local Justice of the Peace candidates.

PLEASE — don't forget to put your ballot in the certificate envelope and sign the certificate envelope. If you don't do either, your ballot will be considered defective and YOUR VOTE WILL NOT COUNT! We cannot contact you either, once we receive the ballot.

DO NOT SIGN YOUR BALLOT.

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
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WALLINGFORD SENIORS

To be eligible for a passport, you must be: a resident of Vermont and 62 years old or older, or a Veteran of the uniformed services - provide form DD214 or see indication on driver's license (after 7/1/13). 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Wallingford Local Hazard Mitigation Plan

The Town of Wallingford's Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP) is in the process of being updated as required by FEMA every five years. A committee comprised of Selectboard members Nelson Tift and Bruce Duchesne, Highway Department employees Steve Lanfear and Charlie Woods, Town Clerk and Treasurer Julie Sharon, Town Administrator Sandi Switzer, and Wallingford Volunteer Fire Dept. Fire Chief Michael Hughes has been working with Steffanie Bourque, Emergency Management Planner with the Rutland Regional Planning Commission (RRPC), on the update.

The purpose of the LHMP is to assist the Town in identifying natural hazards facing our community, ranking them according to local vulnerabilities, and then identify strategies to reduce risks from vulnerabilities of highest concern.

The draft document was shared with the Planning Commission on August 12 for review and commentary and then submitted to the full Selectboard on August 17. Residents are being invited to review the LHMP and submit written comments to the Selectboard by September 8. A hard copy of the draft document is available at Town Hall. Citizens may also view it online by visiting the Rutland Regional Planning Commission's website <https://www.rutlandrpc.org/> or the Town of Wallingford's municipal website <https://www.wallingfordvt.com/documents>.

Selectboard Meeting Highlights

08/03. The Selectboard: 1) discussed J. Duda's proposal to relocate the house at 44 Mill Street that now sits on the road. They declined to pay for the relocation, and she will acquire a Street Excavation Permit for any work that will impact the road; 2) adopted a Driveway Policy; 3) discussed the upcoming weather forecast with Emergency Mgt. Director M. Tessier; 4) approved the Annual Financial Mgt. Questionnaire; 5) approved the FY'21 municipal tax rate; 6) approved assessing the 8% penalty for late homestead filers; 7) tabled the basketball court rehab until more estimates are available; 8) approved Tyler Shelvey installing a skateboard ramp at the rec field; 9) accepted Champlain Valley's heating oil price; 10) agreed to discontinue the high cost of testing the lake as the municipal swim facilities are closed to the public; 11) agreed to run additional ads for the zoning administrator vacancy; 12) discussed a junk complaint; nonprofit funding request requirements; vendor permits; and highway personnel; 13) acknowledged VLCT's W. Masure's recommendations related to bike jumps at Stone Meadow; 14) discussed resuming the in-person meetings for the Masons upstairs; and 15) discussed with Cecile Betit the new rules related to power company obligations during outages.

08/17. The Selectboard: 1) reviewed a grants in aid document for equipment purchases; 2) heard a complaint from P. Burroughs regarding lighting installed by GMP recently; 3) received the Local Hazard Mitigation Plan; 4) discussed the bike jumps at Stone Meadow; 5) agreed to rerun the Zoning Administrator help ad; 6) removed the parental and family leave section from the Employee Handbook; 7) reviewed AT&T's letter about the cell tower lease; 8) moved the Labor Day meeting to 9/8; 9) approved the annual inspection of the roof at Town Hall; and 10) agreed that Atty. Merriman should provide an official notice of the status of the S. Taylor house location. Mr. Baker reviewed the roads that need grading and roadside brush that needs cutting.

WHITE ROCKS GATEWAY PROJECT

The Trust for Public Land is excited to be partnering with the Town of Wallingford and the Green Mountain National Forest to ensure the long-term protection and public access to the 464-acre White Rocks Gateway on Hartsboro Road, located adjacent to the White Rocks National Recreation Area. Featuring rare old-growth hemlock, rare peatland Rich Fern, and northern hardwood forest, the property provides a critical wildlife linkage along the Spine of the Greens and includes 3.5 miles of trails that connect to the Ice Beds Trail, Appalachian Trail and Long Trail. The project envisions a fully accessible trail through the old growth forest which would be the first ADA-accessible trail in the southern unit of the GMNF.

The Trust for Public Land (TPL), a national non-profit whose mission is land-for-people, is leading the project over the next two years. The total project cost is \$1.13 million. TPL has secured a \$950,000 public grant from the Land and Water Conservation Fund for the land acquisition. In addition to this public funding, the final 20% of the project cost (est. \$180,000) will be raised from private foundations and individuals over the coming year. TPL is planning to raise a significant portion of this private need from regional foundations. Our goal is to raise the balance from individuals in the community.

TPL and the Conservation Commission are now seeking interested volunteer to join a fundraising committee to approach potential donors who are eager to see the White Rocks Gateway protected from development and activated to support additional outdoor recreation. 
White Rocks Gateway: Role of Volunteer Fundraising Committee:



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
