#### **Homestead Declaration**

Don't forget to file your annual Homestead Declaration Form HS-122 by April 15, regardless if you file for an extension!



All dogs, six months of age or older, must be registered annually at the Town Clerk's Office by April 1<sup>st</sup>. A valid rabies certificate must be submitted, and we're happy to issue licenses through the mail. Fees are \$10 spayed/neutered; otherwise, it's \$14.

We'll be holding our annual dog/cat rabies clinic in March. Watch for further details.

If you wish to run for office, you must file a petition, signed by at least 1% of registered voters, and a candidate consent form with the Town Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 24th. Forms are available at the Town Clerk's Office, under Documents on the Town website (wallingfordvt.com), or on the VT Secretary of State's website at https://www.sec.state.vt.us.

Petitioned Articles for the Town Meeting ballot, signed by at least 5% of registered voters, are due in the Town Clerk's Office by 4:30 p.m. on January 13th.

# Selectboard Meeting Highlights

12/06. The Selectboard: 1) approved adding Honorable Mentions to meeting agendas to start each meeting with notable good news; 2) discussed the weight limit of the Van Wyck Bridge with Steve Baker and Amy Gilbert regarding logging operations; 3) approved the purchase of an attachment from Caterpillar for the loader for the V-plow, the all angle plow, street brooms and forks; 4) discussed the Revenue Augmentation Trust Fund, that terminates in 12/23, and which the disposition of must go before the voters at 2022 Town Meeting. Several options were discussed. A few Board members will devise the wording of a ballot item that would utilize 2/3 of the funds for a large project with the balance to remain in the Trust; 5) discussed the Public Safety, Recreation and a portion of the Appropriations FY23 budget; 6) agreed not to mail Town Meeting ballots to every voter due to the high cost; 7) declined to make a Rec Committee appointment; 8) discussed the location of the annual Informational; 9) approved forming a 5-person committee to make recommendations for ARPA funding requests; 10) agreed to continue in-person meetings be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of Town Hall; 11) approved purchasing \$25 holiday gift cards for employees; and 12) declined to a request to send legislators emails or letters on H.115 related to manufacturer responsibilities for household hazardous waste collection costs.

12/20. The Selectboard: 1) discussed the Highway and the remaining Appropriations FY23 budget; 2) the Van Wyck Bridge; 3) the Rec Budget and Rec Committee concerns; 4) road items with the Road Commissioner; 5) approved the Carving Studio Bench request; 6) approved forming an ARPA Committee and appointed members; 7) approved the 2022 mowing contractor; 8) approved a liquor license; and 9) approved the annual elevator inspection contract.



Part One ~ Thrive in Celebration ~ Community Acupuncture Clinic Nearing 9 Years of Service to the Region By: Virginia Voronin, Licensed Acupuncturist 8 Lisa M. Donohue, MA, LMT

Did you know that community acupuncture, originating in China, has become popular in the US? Many supporting studies and testimonials report that community acupuncture to be a very effective healing modality. In New York City, in the 1970's The Nada Protocol (National Acupuncture Detoxification Association), was developed. It's an ear acupuncture treatment that is still widely researched and used in treatment for a variety of disorders such as sleep, headaches, physical pain, digestion, depression, anxiety, addictions and many other health concerns. The Nada Protocol consists of putting five acupuncture needles or special adhesive seeds on specific acupuncture points in each ear. Then, participants quietly sit together for 30-40 minutes. "It can be a very profound meditative experience" says Virginia Voronin.

She has led several community acupuncture clinics in southern Vermont in the last ten years. And is presently offering a monthly clinic at Thrive Center of the Green Mountains, just south of Rutland, Vermont. "I have witnessed some very impressive results with this simple healing modality" she says. Virginia believes that sitting quietly in a meditative atmosphere improves the effects these ear points have on the whole body, mind, and spirit. And, for people who regularly meditate report that their meditative experience deepens. "People come in with migraines and leave without them; people come in with back pain and leave pain free. But one of the most rewarding results for most people that is that they leave with a revived sense of peace and relaxation." In the eight plus years at Thrive Center there are some participants who have come almost every month since the beginning. One person reports that after the clinic she sleeps like a baby for the next ten nights or so. Another person reports that their depression has diminished significantly. After each clinic there is a question, comment and sharing time.

We plan to resume again on January 25th, weather and pandemic factors dependent.
