Wallingford ARPA Committee

The Wallingford Selectboard has appointed the ARPA Committee to make recommendations on how the Town of Wallingford should appropriate its ARPA funds. Final decisions will be made by the Selectboard.

The members of the Committee are Bob Allen, Elicia Pinsonault, Anne Awad, Jim Bagnall, Bruce Dobbins, Grey Wicker, and myself. We typically meet on the third Tuesday of each month. The public is welcome to all meetings, and they are posted at least 48 hours in advance.

The Committee is currently developing a process for informing the public about ARPA opportunities and the process for project application and decision-making. When this information is available, we will make it available at the Town Hall, on Front Porch Forum, and in The Standard.

The original public meeting held by the Selectboard was prior to the Final Rule being adopted by the US Treasury Department. According to the information available to us at that meeting, the parameters for allowable expenditures were very narrow. Under the Final Rule, the possibilities are much broader. If you have questions in this regard, please feel free to contact Sandi Switzer, Town Administrator, or anyone on the ARPA Committee.

This is an exciting and challenging opportunity for our town. The members of the Committee are pleased to have a role in helping Wallingford make the best possible use of these funds. We look forward to hearing from you. Peg Soule

Did you know that a Vermont resident, who is a veteran of the armed forces of the US, and who is 60% or more disabled due to service connected disability, may receive a FREE permanent fishing or combination license. A letter from the VA specifying the service connected disability rating is required at time of licensing.

Selectboard Meeting Highlights

02/22. Road Commissioner P. Baker gave his report on roads and equipment.

The Selectboard: 1) agreed there were no special road or bridge weights to report to Vtrans, and there would be no mud season postings in Wallingford this year; 2) accepted N. Bresinsky's resignation from the Conservation Commission and appointed D. Duhaime to fill the seat; 3) approved the registration process for the Rutland County Little League with local fields; 4) approved advertising for summer employment positions; 5) approved the Library's use of the Town's bulk mail permit; 6) reviewed the Security Policy and list of employees with keys; 7) agreed to post the vacancy on the ARPA Committee (R. Korchak resigned); 8) thanked P. Pranger for her service on the Board and willingness to become an Auditor again; and 9) discussed last year's TS price increase.

N. Tift noted the Town did not receive the ERSA Grant for upgrades to the Rim Trail at Stone Meadow. The Selectboard authorized the Conservation Commission to submit a Letter of Interest to the Recreation Trail Program for funds to upgrade the Rim Trail. However, C. Macleod decided not to move forward with the Recreation Trail Program due to time constraints.

There was a lengthy discussion about appointing new members to the Recreation Committee.

03/07. New members J. Jankus and C. Behrendt were welcomed and the Board was reorganized.

Road Commissioner P. Baker had no update on the injector pump ordered for the 2014 Kenworth. There was discussion on Trudy Dias' driveway being washed out. The Selectboard discussed buying a new grader, seeking financing options, and budgeting a substantial amount each year for equipment replacement.

The Selectboard: 1) approved Vtrans Annual Financial Plan; 2) approved allowing PEG TV to add microphones for use at these meetings; 3) approved the ARPA Mission Statement; 4) adopted the Public Works Mutual Aid Agreement; 5) approved annual appointments/reappointments; 6) supported lifting the face mask requirement for Town Hall with a recommendation unvaccinated individuals wear face masks; 7) agreed to terminate the Zoom account; and 8) discussed the elementary school's Stormwater design prepared by Watershed Consultants.

GREEN MOUNTAIN PASSPORT PROGRAM

What is it? A program offering free day-use passes to Vermont State Parks and Historic Sites for Vermonters.

Who is Eligible? Vermont residents at least 62 years of age, or Vermont Veterans of the uniformed services. (Legal residency shall be the same as for voting.)

How Do I Get My Passport Card? Complete an application at your town clerk's office; submit a one-time fee of \$2.00; and receive your Green Mountain Passport Card—good for life (non-transferrable). A Veteran of the uniformed services (under age 62) must provide Form DD214 or show proof on driver's license. FREE Healthcare Event at the Wallingford Town Hall!

Adult wellness meetings which focus on oral health. Do you or someone you know struggle with obtaining basic dental care? This event is brought to you in part by the United Way of Rutland County. Working together with the RC Free Clinic to provide community-based care whenever possible.



Veterans and Property Taxes: What You Should Know

Don't forget to file your application to receive the 2022 Property Tax Exemption for Disabled Veterans and their Survivors before MAY 1ST.

The following are eligible for the exemption: Veterans receiving Disability Compensation at a rating of 50% or higher: Veterans receiving Non-Service Connected Pension aka V.A. Pension or Widower's Pension); or Military retirement pay for a permanent medical military retirement.

The exemption is \$40,000 in Wallingford. The exemption reduces the appraised value of the home prior to the assessment of taxes. The exemption only applies to homes that are owned by the veteran or survivor and is the primary residence.

To receive the exemption, the veteran must provide proof of eligibility to the Vermont Office of Veterans Affairs every year before May 1st. Veterans who are determined to be totally and permanently disabled only have to provide proof of eligibility the first year they use the benefit for a home (if they move to a new home in a different town, they will have to provide proof of eligibility again). They also must provide proof of eligibility by May 1st.

Proof of eligibility is provided by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Need help? Call the VT Office of Veterans Affairs at 802-828-3379.


One time registration fee of \$20 per family if registering by Tuesday, May 31st and \$25 thereafter.
