You will be given three ballots and may only vote one ballot.




Our Boy With a Boot Garden

Our Boy With a Boot Garden is due for a modest upgrade. A small group of volunteers submitted a plan for the Garden to the University of Vermont (Extension Service Master Gardeners) for designation as a Master Garden, and we were one of several projects around the state to be approved. We do not plan drastic changes but, over 5 years or so, we will be improving the soils and dividing perennials (keeping the natives and moving out the non-natives). Planting native plants in Vermont puts the plants that host native insects and that love our soils and climate here to thrive. Native plants also encourage pollinators, those bees and butterflies that love Vermont and want to be here and survive here.



Town has supported our plan and, in discussion with the Select Board, it was noted that the garden is on a visible corner of the main intersection in Town. A well maintained and attractive garden helps the village and encourages visitors and economic development. Educational programs will be offered at the Library which has catalogued books on native perennials and pollinator gardens. We hope a few teachers at the elementary school will walk their classes down to be part of the garden. Elementary children (and middle and high school students, of course) will be welcome as volunteers. The garden is on the corner of the Wallingford House lot. Seniors and disabled adults will be welcome to help maintain the garden or to keep volunteers company as they work.

Justice of the Peace

If you have ever considered becoming a Justice of the Peace, now is the time to do so. JP's are elected at the November general election. Wallingford elects 10 JPs whose two-year term begins on February 1, 2023.

Some of the duties of the JP are mandatory and some are discretionary. Mandatory duties are those duties which, by law, the justice must perform. These duties include serving as an election official at town and statewide elections, hearing tax assessment appeals and serving as a member of the Board of Tax Abatement.

Discretionary functions of the office include performance of marriages/civil unions, administering oaths, serving as a notary public, and serving as a magistrate. JPs have the power to perform these functions but are not required to do so in any particular instance.

Candidates for JP are nominated by town party caucus or by the town party committee at a properly warned meeting. Town party caucuses must be held by August 12, 2022. A candidate may also run as an independent. 17 V.S.A. §2413.

Please contact Republican Chair Pat Pranger at cpapat@vermontel.net (802-446-2066) before 8/12. No financial disclosure or consent of candidate form is required for justice of the peace nominations.

Since there is currently no Democrat Chair, you can run as an Independent. You'll need to submit a JP Consent of Candidate Form along with a Petition with 16 voter signatures.

Selectboard Meeting Highlights

07/05. Road Commissioner P. Baker discussed additional paving projects, culvert, and ditching projects. Animal Control Officer J. Elwell reported on a recent dog incident. The Selectboard: 1) approved the fireworks display permit for Wallingford Day and heard an overview of the day's events by M. French; 2) approved the bicycle parade route; 3) thanked Mrs. Kaminski for donating funds for the fireworks; 4) approved A. Peterson's request to use the ballfield for flag football this summer; 5) deferred a decision for a skateboard clinic until more information was available; 6) discussed a recent incident at Elfin Lake; 7) thanked A. Cote and J. Dickerman for their help removing tree limbs at the ballfield's portable restroom; 8) discussed reminding WFD #1 officials of the fireworks permit requirement at the Wallingford Lodge; 9) noted a Public Record Request received by the Town; and 10) approved annual salary increases.

07/18. Road Commissioner P. Baker reported on ongoing projects including an update on the salt and sand shed, the Carving Studio bench being placed on the library lawn, and roadside mowing. Treasurer J. Sharon presented preliminary FY22 financial results. D. Potter announced he's running for State Representative.

The Selectboard: 1) approved applying for a grant for a new salt/sand shed structure with the assistance from Otter Creek Engineering; 2) approved appointing A. Fahoury to the Energy Committee; 3) accepted J. Jankus's resignation from the Recreation Committee; 4) agreed K. Luzader should sign the Declaration of Inclusion approved by the Board in April; and 5) approved purchasing heating oil from Champlain Valley, the low bidder.

Are you past due on your property taxes?

The Vermont Housing Finance Agency (VHFA) is offering the Vermont Homeowner Assistance Program (VHAP) to provide help for homeowners who have experienced financial hardship due to COVID-19 after January 21, 2020. Financial hardship due to COVID-19 includes loss in income or material increase in living expenses from job loss, reduction in work hours, increased costs due to child care or illness, or the need to care for a family member (including a hardship that began before the pandemic, but continued during and after).

Income-eligible Vermonters* may apply for assistance for their primary residence to avoid home foreclosure or homeowner displacement. This can include assistance with overdue mortgage payments, homeowners' association fees, property taxes, and/or utilities (including electric, gas, fuel oil, and water). The program is expected to run for several years.

*Less than or equal to 150% of <u>Area Median</u> Income.

ARPA COMMITTEE NEWS!

The ARPA committee met on July 19th. We have received seven applications to date. There were a number of other suggestions presented to the Selectboard in September that are not represented in those seven. With the range of possibilities widened by the Final Rule, many of the ideas presented at that meeting might now be within the official guidelines, and we encourage people to complete applications if they would like to move these ideas forward.

In the process of reviewing the applications, we have realized that we need some additional information, which we are adding to the application available on the town website and at Town Hall. We will be contacting those who have already submitted applications their for this additional information. Of particular note is that a contractor's estimate of the cost necessary. We are also expecting the applicants demonstrate that they have aggressively researched other available sources of funds.

The committee continues to work on the Matrix that will be used to evaluate the applications. It is very important that this result in a fair and transparent process for making our recommendations to the Selectboard.

Our next meeting will be August 16th at Town hall. Please feel free to attend.








VOTING:

When: Tuesday, August 9, 2022; 10:00 am - 7:00 pm at the Wallingford Town Hall, 75 School Street. ADA assessible at the Taft Terrace entrance (east side of building).

What: Election of a candidate that a voter believes should be a political party's candidate for elected office to run in the general election in November.

Voter Registration: Online at https://olvr.vermont.gov, in person at Town Clerk's office, or same day voter registration at the polls.

Early Voting (between now and August 8): In person at the Town Clerk's office. To request an absentee ballot, you can call the Town Clerk's office at 802-446-2336 or request one online at My Voter Page at https://mvp.vermont.gov.
