Property Tax Bills will be issued next month. If you've changed your mailing address since last August, please let us know so that you receive your bill.



ARPA Committee Report

The ARPA Committee has begun receiving applications for ARPA funding. The Final Rules regarding use of these funds has expanded eligibility considerably, so ideas that we had originally been told were NOT eligible, now could be. We encourage those with proposals to complete the application and submit it to the committee. The application is available on the town website (https://www.wallingfordvt.com/) and at the Town Hall. Information about ARPA funds, committee agendas, and meeting minutes are also available there.

The ARPA Committee has updated the application to include a bit of additional information. Applicants who have already submitted their applications will be contacted by the committee. Those who may have already downloaded the application but not yet submitted it should go to the website or the Town Hall for an UPDATED APPLICATION.

The ARPA Committee is continuing its work developing the matrix which will be used to rank the applications. Applications will be evaluated as they are submitted once this matrix is complete.

Please feel free to contact the committee with any questions, and we will do our best to answer them.



Justice of the Peace

If you have ever considered becoming a Justice of the Peace, now is the time to do so. JP's are elected at the November general election. Wallingford elects 10 JPs whose two-year term begins on February 1, 2023.

Some of the duties of the JP are mandatory and some are discretionary. Mandatory duties are those duties which, by law, the justice must perform. These duties include serving as an election official at town and statewide elections, hearing tax assessment appeals and serving as a member of the Board of Tax Abatement.

Discretionary functions of the office include performance of marriages/civil unions, administering oaths, serving as a notary public, and serving as a magistrate. JPs have the power to perform these functions but are not required to do so in any particular instance.

Candidates for JP are nominated by town party caucus or by the town party committee at a properly warned meeting. Town party caucuses must be held by August 12, 2022. A candidate may also run as an independent. 17 V.S.A. §2413.

Please contact Republican Chair Pat Pranger at cpapat@vermontel.net (802-446-2066) before 8/12. No financial disclosure or consent of candidate form is required for justice of the peace nominations.

Since there is currently no Democrat Chair, you can run as an Independent. You'll need to submit a JP Consent of Candidate Form along with a Petition with 16 voter signatures.

Selectboard Meeting Highlights

06/06. The Selectboard: 1) approved a one-year contract with the Sheriff; 2) discussed the water run off on Nash Drive and plugged catch basins in town (A-1 will be contacted for the annual catch basin cleaning); 3) reviewed paving bids with no action taken; 4) agreed to contact two engineering firms for design quotes for the salt shed; 5) agreed to seek an estimate for line striping in town; 6) signed the letter of intent for Grans in Aid for FY23; 7) declined to lower the speed limit on a portion of Ice Bed Road; 8) agreed to recommend Nick Flanders appointment to the School Board; 8) approved Emergency Mgt. Director J. Bagnall's recommendation to use funding through RRPC to designate the Town Hall as an emergency site for hot weather; 9) approved signing a Letter of Support for the VTrans Bicycle and Pedestrian Grant Program grant application to construct new School Street sidewalks estimated at \$542,828 with the Town match 20 percent; 10) approved the hiring V. Turso as a summer rec program counselor; 11) approved sending letters to dog owners who failed to register their dogs; 12) agreed to meet again on 7/05; 13) discussed the traffic concerns during the Memorial Day parade; 14) discussed the edging of the basketball court and resurfacing of the tennis court; 16) discussed movie nights being proposed by the Rec Committee; and 17) agreed to seek legal counsel following executive session.

06/13. The Selectboard met in executive session with the town attorney; no action was taken.

November 8th General Election: All active voters will be mailed an absentee ballot in late September. Again, you will be provided with a pre-paid envelope to return the ballot.

We will still conduct each election upstairs at the Town Hall. You will still have the option to appear in person to vote if you choose not to vote by absentee ballot.




