The Town Hall will be closed on Monday, October 10th in observance of Columbus Day. The Transfer Station WILL be open.



Your Property Tax payment for the first half of FY23 is due before or on Monday, October 17th.

Please remit your payment as follows: 1) in person; 2) MAIL to 75 School Street, Wallingford VT 05773 before 10/17; or, 3) place through the mail slot in the front door of the Town Hall by October 17th.

Please note: For those of you who have still not received credit or notification of your homestead rebate, please pay the first half of your taxes as listed on your Property Tax Bill. Once we have been notified of your rebate by the State of Vermont, your taxes will be adjusted accordingly and you will be sent an updated property tax bill that will show a reduction for the second half payment.



November General Election—
Tuesday, 11-8: A ballot will be mailed in late September to every voter on the statewide voter checklist.

We will still conduct the election at the Wallingford Town Hall, 75 School Street, from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. if you wish to come in and vote. If you do not bring the ballot with you, you will be required to sign an affidavit that you have not previously returned the ballot sent to you or cast any other ballot.

Postage for the mailing and return of ballots will be paid by the Secretary of State's office. The ballot will also contain, on the reverse, the local Justice of the Peace candidates.

PLEASE — don't forget to put your ballot in the certificate envelope and sign the certificate envelope. If you don't do either, your ballot will be considered defective and YOUR VOTE WILL NOT COUNT! We will be required to contact you to cure the ballot by the voting deadline.

There is a "ballot drop box" at our side entrance on Taft Terrace if you return your ballot after hours. All ballots must be received by us no later than 7 p.m. on Tuesday, November 8th.

IMPORTANT!

Please contact the Wallingford Highway Department at 802-446-2472 to find out what permissions/permits are required before you install a driveway or do any work in ditches. This includes logging operations.

Reminder, do not rake, deposit or blow leaves or yard waste into ditches.

Registering Posted Land

Putting up posted signs conveys a message to ask first or keep out. For extra assurance, you can choose to register your posted land. Often referred to 'legally posted', it means hunting, fishing and/or trapping is prohibited without written permission.

The landowner may maintain signs that: Prohibit hunting, fishing or trapping; Prohibit any combination of the three; or State all or any combination of the three are allowed by Permission Only. **To meet the full requirements of the law (10 V.S.A., § 5201 to 5206), the posting must be recorded annually with the Town Clerk for a fee of \$5.**

Selectboard Meeting Highlights

09/06. Residents requested chloride be spread on East Street; increasing law enforcement patrols on East Street to enforce speed limits; and roadside trees/brush needs be addressed on East Street. Road Commission Baker reported that most of the roadside mowing had been completed; the road crew would be working on the Carrara Camp Road bridge next week; he'll work on the bike jumps at Stone Meadow; and the Highway Department will work on the Maple Street retaining wall.

The Selectboard: 1) approved up to \$35,000 on paving Homer Stone Road; 2) agreed individuals experienced in the use of chainsaws may operate the equipment at Stone Meadow following VLCT's recommendations; 3) referred Fire District #1 resident S. St. Claire to the Prudential Committee about his concern with rising water rates; 4) appointed S. Pytlík to the Recreation Committee; 5) tabled the Elfin Lake Erosion Reduction Design Proposals until a Special Meeting on Friday, 9/9 as there were only three Board members present; 6) tabled the West Hill Cemetery gate; 7) heard a proposal about displaying military banners in the town to honor service members (Ms. Filskov will research logistics, including VTrans and Green Mt. Power permissions and compile a comprehensive list of veterans.); 8) P. Baker requested installing No Through Traffic signs on Church Street; and 9) C. Behrendt suggested contacting Casella to find out whether they supplied recycling signage for the Transfer Station.

09/09. The Selectboard reviewed three Elfin Lake Erosion Reduction Proposals and chose Fitzgerald Environmental Associates. The Selectboard meetings will be moved to the Town Administrator's office at the request of B. Duchesne.

09/19. Road Commission Baker gave a status report on: 1) Carrara Camp Road Bridge 2) Grants in Aid project on Chapin Road and Blackwood Road; 3) Maple Street retaining wall; 4) the 2014 Kenworth repairs; 5) roadside mowing; and 6) the possible purchase of a brush hog attachment to perform our own roadside mowing.

The Selectboard: 1) tabled pursuing a Vtrans Stormwater Mitigation Grant for the salt/sand shed until further research can be done; 2) signed the Fitzgerald Environmental Associates agreement; 3) approved the Errors & Omissions Assessor's request for Comcast; 4) approved the Taylors moving the gate for West Hill Cemetery; 5) discussed the status of the Creek Road bridge; 6) approved replacing the locks on the front and side doors at Town Hall; 7) heard a report on the bench dedication; 8) agreed a no thru traffic sign should be installed on Church Street; 9) agreed that Elfin Lake needs upgrades to plumbing, interior painting, etc.

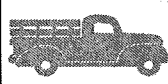

Our fee is \$3, and we accept cash or check for our fee. Excluding snowmobiles, we cannot accept a renewal notice that has been expired for more than two months.

AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN

The November 1st deadline for ARPA applications is fast approaching. Applications are available on the Wallingford Town website and in print from Town Administrator Sandi Switzer. We've heard lots of good ideas discussed, but they can't be considered without an application. It is possible to apply for a project already underway or a purchase already made. If the application is approved, funds can be reimbursed for money already spent. All applications become part of the public record.

At the next meeting at 6:30, September 27th, the Committee will review applications received to date for completeness. Particular attention will be paid to efforts shown in search of other available funding and the submission of contractor cost estimates.

Beginning with the November 15th meeting, the ARPA Committee members will individually review and evaluate applications according to the developed matrix. After discussion of the individual scores, they will be averaged into Committee scores. The Committee will then decide upon final recommendations to make to the Selectboard.

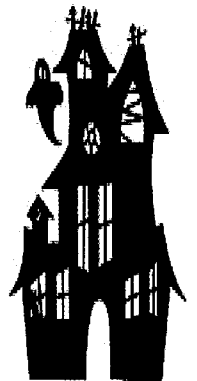

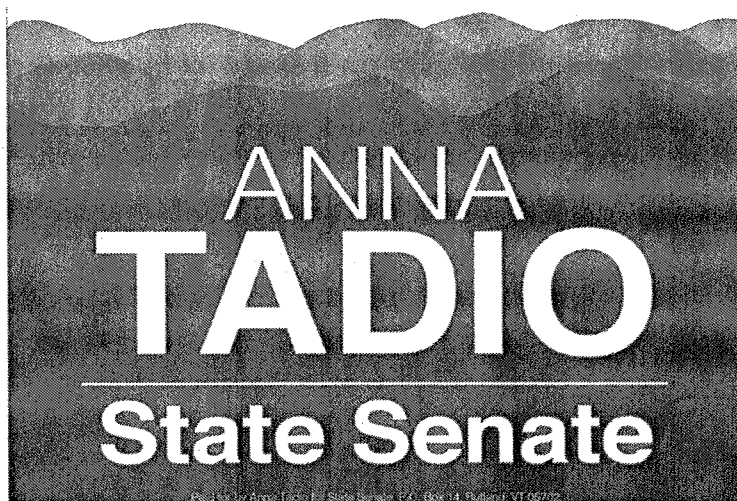

Wallingford Town Hall Wednesday Concert Series

The Wallingford Town Hall Wednesday Concert Series has started up again and will feature DaddyLongLegs on Wednesday, **October 26th at 7:00 p.m.** A bluegrass trio, DaddyLongLegs, features three of Vermont's finest acoustic players. Violinist David Gusakov was a member of Burlington's progressive bluegrass pioneers Pine Island and gypsy-jazz outfit Swing Noire. Banjo specialist Rick Ceballos and multi-instrumentalist Matt Witten are well known in Vermont traditional, old-time and bluegrass circles. The group performed at Wallingford concerts on two occasions in the past to rave reviews. Infusing catchy folk songs, Celtic and "old-timey" melodies, and early minstrel and jazz pieces with passion and intricacy, Daddy Long Legs is playful and dynamic. The three musicians play fiddle, viola, banjo, gourd banjo, piano, guitar, and percussion, as well as sing. Daddy Longlegs creates vibrant, sensitive and surprising 21st-century folk music.

Gypsy Reel will be performing on Wednesday, November 16th - playing high energy stirring music rooted in the Celtic tradition, but garnered from the whole world. Their music is an exciting synthesis of world rhythms and influences from 3 continents. The line-up includes talented banjoist Claudine Langille, Graham Parker - eclectic fiddler extraordinaire, Camille Parker on mandolin & bodhran and singing in French, Spanish and English, Silas Hamilton on standup bass and Reagh Greenleaf on bodhran and vocals.

All concerts start at 7:00 p.m. with suggested donations of \$10 to \$15/person with all proceeds going to musicians less 10 percent to the Town.

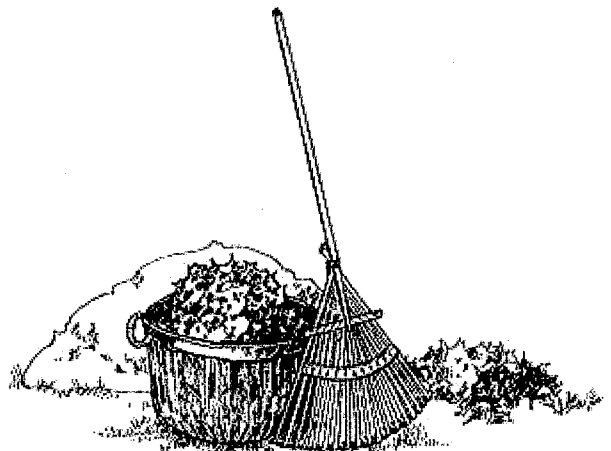

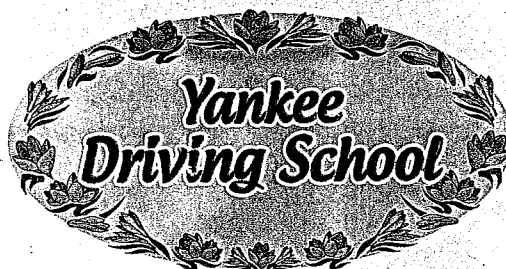
