#### **Selectboard Meeting Highlights**

**10/24.** The Selectboard: 1) elected B. Duchesne as Chair and K. Luzader Vice Chair; 2) approved posting the Selectboard vacancy; 3) authorized the Town Admin. to sign the Cargill Winter Road Salt agreement; 4) heard a status report of the Hot Weather Annex by S. Bourque; 5) reviewed the Quarterly Financials with J. Sharon; 6) approved transferring the last ARPA payment from the general to the subaccount; 7) agreed to continue N. Tift's tradition of donating his stipend (to the musical groups hired for the concerts) and installing bench in his memory, and possibly establishing a scholarship fund in his name; 8) approved J. Jankus expending up to \$150 for an assessment of Town Hall's cybersecurity for an ARPA application; and 9) discussed the likelihood of the Town having to undergo a townwide reappraisal in the next few years.

**11/07.** The Selectboard held executive session to interview the applicants for the Selectboard vacancy. The Selectboard held a public hearing regarding the Revised Traffic Ordinance Amendment special vote for 11/8.

The Selectboard: 1) accepted M. Over's resignation from the Rec Committee; 2) appointed Mark Tessier to serve on the Selectboard; 3) approved a tax sale to be held next month; 4) appointed J. Bagnall and M. Hughes to serve on the Rutland Regional Emergency Management Committee; 5) approved offering BCBS insurance; 6) approved Rutland Printing's quote for the town report; 7) authorized the Chair to sign the revised agreement with Fitzgerald Environmental Associates for Elfin Lake erosion designs; and 8) agreed with the assessor's recommendation to be proactive in scheduling a reappraisal firm before the state mandates reappraisal.

**11/21.** The Selectboard: 1) discussed the Creek Road Bridge with Road Commissioner P. Baker; 2) B. Dobbins discussed transportation matters; 3) E. Berner gave an update on the revised zoning regulations; and 4) The Capital and Town Government budgets were discussed.

Wallingford Transfer Station News & Information

Compostable Information. I hope you all use the compost bin at the Wallingford Transfer Station. I compost at home but there are a few items that my composter won't miraculously turn into loamy compost (like bones), and I deposit those items in the compost bin. The TS and Town Hall sell a box of 25 small compostable bags for \$4. They make it so much easier to bring your compost to the TS.

Recyclables: Recyclables can be a problem for the Town if they are not washed clean before being put into the TS's recyclable bin. When these recyclable items arrive at the Regional TS in Rutland, they are sorted and any dirty items removed. As a penalty, the Town is charged an extra fee for unclean recyclable items and for recyclable items that are above the allowed recycling code numbers. Items with a triangular code marking (usually on the bottom of the plastic item) above 7 are not allowed as recyclable. Most clean plastic items marked with a 1-7 number are acceptable, but there are a few items that are marked 1-7 that are not acceptable. Shredded plastic should be bagged and put into the trash, not the recyclable bin. Your used paper plates, plastic cutlery, straws, used oil cans, and pizza boxes should go into the trash, not into the recyclables. No PVC or Propylene items should go into the recycle bin.

Questions: If you have concerns or questions about recyclables, compostables or any other category, ask Jerry or Art, the employees at the TS. They know their job. They are friendly, nice and funny.



## Flood Resilient Communities Fund – Property Buyout Program

Flood Resilient Communities Fund (FRCF) is a property buyout program for flood-vulnerable properties that was established by the Vermont Legislature with the intent of improving community resilience and reducing flood hazards in Vermont. This is a voluntary program focused on buyouts of flood-vulnerable properties.

Example Projects: home buyouts, vacant lot purchases, restoring natural floodplain access to improve floodplain function, dam removal projects that have the benefit of reducing flood risk, natural infrastructure and nature-based solutions for flood storage or improved floodplain and river functions, green infrastructure, and low-impact development to manage stormwater and reduce future flooding.







