Homestead Declaration

Don't forget to file your annual Homestead Declaration form by April 17, even if you do not have to file a state income tax return.

Dog Registrations

All dogs, six months of age or older, must be registered annually at the Town Clerk's Office by April 1st. A



<u>valid</u> rabies certificate must be submitted, and we're happy to issue licenses through the mail. Fees are \$10 spayed/neutered; otherwise, it's \$14.

We'll be holding our annual dog/cat rabies clinic in March. Watch for further details.

Thinking about serving your community? If you wish to run for office, you must submit a petition, signed by at least 1% of registered voters (16), and a candidate consent form to the Town Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 30th. Forms are available at the Town Clerk's Office, under Documents on the Town website (wallingfordvt.com), or on the VT Secretary of State's website (sos.vermont.gov).

Petitioned Articles for the Town Meeting ballot, signed by at least 5% of registered voters (79), are due in the Town Clerk's Office by 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, January 19th.

Selectboard Meeting Highlights

12/05. The Selectboard: 1) listened to a report from Road Commissioner P. Baker about the Creek Road bridge; the Maple Street retaining wall; the pending debris blower purchase; the roadside mower rental agreement; the Better Back Roads grant application process; and projected hikes in the cost of highway expenses for FY24; 2) reviewed the FY'24 Public Safety budget; 3) heard a report by Shannon Pytlik on the Flood Resiliency Funding Program available through FEMA for buying out property in flood zones; 3) reviewed revisions to the Purchasing Policy; 4) were reminded of the runoff election for JP; 5) were told that the one tax sale has been postponed; 6) thanked P. Baker for removing the bike jumps at Stone Meadow; 7) agreed that the Conservation Commission could set their own meeting times; and 8) approved holiday gift certificates for employees.

12/19. The Selectboard: 1) heard a report from Road Commissioner P. Baker on projects, the recent snowstorm, and three grant applications completed with the Town Administrator; 2) agreed not to sign a roadside mower agreement with Haven House; 3) reviewed the FY'24 proposed Highway (along with grant and other funding for a new salt/sand shed and Creek Road Bridge), Appropriations & Recreation budget; 3) approved the Purchasing Policy revisions; and 4) approved issuing a RFP for a townwide Reappraisal for the 2026 Grand List.

Flood Resilient Communities Fund – Property Buyout Program

Flood Resilient Communities Fund (FRCF) is a property buyout program for flood-vulnerable properties that was established by the Vermont Legislature with the intent of improving community resilience and reducing flood hazards in Vermont. This is a voluntary program focused on buyouts of flood-vulnerable properties.

Example Projects: home buyouts, vacant lot purchases, restoring natural floodplain access to improve floodplain function, dam removal projects that have the benefit of reducing flood risk, natural infrastructure and nature-based solutions for flood storage or improved floodplain and river functions, green infrastructure, and low-impact development to manage stormwater and reduce future flooding. WALLINGFORD CONSERVATION COMMISSION **Recycling Formerly Non-Recyclable Plastic**

The Wallingford Conservation Commission has initiated a 6-month Trex Plastic Foam Recycling Program that recycles certain types of plastic that were once designated to be trash. Look for informational signs at the Town Hall and Town Transfer Station.

The following types of plastic are now recyclable ONLY if they are placed in the new labeled bin: bubble wrap, grocery bags, bread bags, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, plastic shipping envelopes, zip-loc and other reclosable food storage bags, cereal bags, case overwrap, salt bags, pallet wrap and stretch film, produce bags, and wood pellet bags. As with all recycling, the materials should be relatively clean. If the 6-month program is successful, a more permanent solution will be pursued.

What can be recycled?

All plastic must be clean, dry and free of food residue.







