Homestead Declaration

Don't forget to file your annual Homestead Declaration form by April 15, even if you do not have to file a state income tax return.

Dog Registrations

All dogs, six months of age or older, must be registered annually at the Town Clerk's Office by April 1st. A valid rabies certificate must be submitted, and we're happy to issue licenses through the mail. Fees are \$10 spayed/neutered; otherwise, it's \$14.

We'll be holding our annual dog/cat rabies clinic in March. Watch for further details.

Annual Meeting of the Mill River Unified Union School District Towns of Clarendon, Shrewsbury, Tinmouth and Wallingford February 23, 2023

The legal voters of the Mill River Unified Union School District are hereby warned to meet at the Mill River Union High School Library on February 23, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. for the annual school district meeting to transact the following business:

ARTICLE 1 To elect the following officers: a. Moderator; b. Clerk; c. Treasurer.

ARTICLE 2 To authorize the Board of School Directors to borrow money pending receipt of payment from district towns by the issuance of notes or orders payable not later than one year from date.

ARTICLE 3 To have presented by the Board of School Directors their estimate of the expenses for the ensuing year. This is a public informational hearing regarding the budget article. (See Article 4).

ARTICLE 4 Shall the voters of the Mill River Unified Union School District approve the Board to expend \$19,826,555 which is the amount the school board has determined to be necessary for the ensuing fiscal year? (By Australian Ballot)

It is estimated that this proposed budget, if approved, will result in education spending of \$21,078.49 per equalized pupil. This projected spending per equalized pupil is 14.7% higher than spending for the current year.

ARTICLE 5 Shall the voters authorize the District to transfer the audited unanticipated surplus funds remaining at the end of FY23 to the building sinking fund, not to exceed \$250,000? (By Australian Ballot)

ARTICLE 6 Shall the voters authorize the District to establish an athletics fund and transfer current surplus funds remaining to this athletics fund in the amount of \$80,000, to be used to maintain district fields, replace outdoor bleachers, and expand elementary sports? (By Australian Ballot)

The meeting will then be recessed to March 7, 2023 (Town Meeting Day) for the purpose of voting by Australian ballot at the usual polling places in the District towns on the following business. Said ballots shall be brought to the Mill River Union High School Cafeteria following the closing of the polls in the District towns where they will be commingled and counted by the officers of the District towns.



Selectboard Meeting Highlights

1/02. The Selectboard: 1) heard a report from the Road Commissioner regarding brush cutting; accepted his offer to sell the town his 10-ton trailer to transport the excavator; discussed grant/funding options for a new sand shed; and funding interim Creek Road bridge paving and repairs; 2) agreed the Tree Warden should be asked to inspect trees near the ballfield parking area; 3) reviewed the FY24 Administration, Insurance, Revenue budget and made additions to the Appropriations budget; 4) approved signing the grant agreement for the School Street sidewalk rehabilitation; 5) approved automatically renewing the Earth Waste & Metal contract; 6) appointed M. Tessier to the Fire Protection Budget Committee; 7) took no action on Act 157 – Eliminate Office of Constable; 8) agreed to move the 2nd meeting to 1/17; 9) discussed the cybersecurity process in order to obtain an estimate for the ARPA application; and 10) agreed to add an article to the town warning pertaining Wallingford Day.



1/17. The Selectboard: 1) heard a report from the Road Commissioner regarding the 14 International Truck that is now inoperable, and approved Vtrans annual Certificate of Highway Mileage Report; 2) reviewed and approved the FY24 budget; 3) reviewed the town warning with Moderator T. Heffernan; 4) signed a contract for a townwide reappraisal to begin in July 2024; 5) signed the Project Manager's Agreement with Rutland Regional Planning Commission for the School Street sidewalk project; 6) discussed the trees at the rec field (north) parking lot; and 7) reviewed the Town Report dedication.





Homestead Declaration

Don't forget to file your annual Homestead Declaration Form HS-122 by April 15, regardless if you file for an extension, or do not have to file a state income tax return. It is your responsibility as the property owner to claim the property as a homestead if you meet the following requirements: 1) You are a Vermont resident; and 2) You own and occupy a homestead as your domicile as of April 1, 2022. *Please note:* If you meet these requirements, except that your homestead is leased to a tenant on April 1, 2022, you may still claim it as a homestead if it is not leased for more than 182 days in the 2022 calendar year.

Property Tax Adjustment

You may be eligible for a property tax adjustment on your 2023 property taxes if your property qualifies as a homestead, and you meet the eligibility requirements. The Property Tax Adjustment Claim Form HS-122 is due April 15 Late filers are charged a fee.

The 2022 HS-122, and HI-144, can be completed online at https:// myvtax.vermont.gov, planned for February 15. If you would rather fill out a paper form, you can print the HS-122 and HS144 forms. 






DON'T SEE YOUR ITEM ON THE LIST?

Try these tests to see if your plastic is acceptable or not.

See if the package will stretch when you pull it. If it tears like paper, then please don't put in the bin.

Is the package shiny or does it make a crinkly/crunchy sound in your hand? If yes, do NOT recycle in the bin.
