The intent of the meeting is to gather input from stakeholders, including Town Officials, residents and businesses, emergency services and other interested parties. During this meeting we will discuss the existing conditions of the bridge, site constraints, and options that should be considered in the scoping report.

Representatives from both VTrans and the Town of Wallingford will be available at the meeting to gather concerns about the project.

Selectboard Meeting Highlights

2/06. Road Commissioner Baker discussed repairs to the sander and '16 Kenworth truck. The board voted to purchase a debris blower with grants in aid equipment funds. RC Baker will obtain the spec sheet for the roadside mower attachment. The Selectboard: 1) Reviewed estimates and approved to purchase the basketball court backboards and rims from American Super Sport; 2) reviewed and approved the revised recreation survey prepared by S. Pytlik; 3) discussed the proposed cross country running track for a 5k through the ballfield and Stone Meadow; 4) tabled the Rec Committee appointment; 5) agreed with S. Pytlik's recommendation to track daily users of Elfin Lake; 6) approved the updated Zero Sort Agreement with Casella for a 5-year term; 7) approved the tax map maintenance proposal with CAI; 8) approved the Rotary's coin drop request for 7/22 or 9/23 (rain date); 9) authorized the signing of the Vermont Emergency Management Enhancement Grant agreement to purchase a generator for Town Hall with grant and ARPA funds; 10) approved an updated lifeguard job description; 11) approved to meet next on 2/21; 12) reviewed the townwide reappraisal funding sources over the next couple of years; 13) B. Duchesne discussed the issue with exploring insurance coverage options with VLCT when the Road Commissioner is performing duties on behalf of the Town, and 14) denied B. Lohsen's request to cover vehicle damage caused by a tree limb on Route 140W.

2/21. Road Commissioner Baker discussed the debris blower purchase, which the Board approved; the Maple St. retaining wall repair; and discussed the brush hog attachment for the excavator. The Selectboard: 1) again denied B. Lohsen's request from 2/06; 2) approved Town Road & Bridge Standards; 3) approved the Municipal Roads General Permit annual report; 4) discussed the elementary school's stormwater maintenance agreement status; 5) tabled the Rec Committee appointment; 6) approved the FD #1's request to use Town Hall for their annual meeting; and 7) B. Duchesne read a letter from Bruce Moreton and agreed to request the BCA to meet again and reconsider the BCA action on 2/15; 8) heard VLCT's report regarding insurance issues relating to the Road Commissioner; 9) reviewed the latest FY expense/budget report; 10) agreed that all Committees should have Mission Statements, similar to Recreation Committee; 11) heard an update on the sidewalk grant project; and12) took no action on L. Donohue's request for the town to apply for a USDA grant to purchase medical equipment to lease back to the Thrive Center.



Update on effort to allow seniors to stay in their homes

About 15 residents from Mount Holly, Shrewsbury and Wallingford continue to meet weekly taking the initial steps that we hope will lead to a structured approach to supporting those who want to stay in their own homes as they age.

We had hoped to include a survey in the March issues of our local papers, but it won't be ready. It will, however, be available at the polls in March, as well as Town and Informational Meetings, Post Offices, local stores, and other public places. This anonymous survey will ask what you need or think that you will need. One over-arching question asks, "what three things do you worry about the most as you think about staying in your home as you get older?"

This initial survey is about needs only. It will be followed by one seeking volunteers to provide services once we know what services are needed! We hope your responses will provide much needed direction as we develop plans. We'll provide drop boxes at each location. There will also be an online version. We'd love to get wide participation.

Many people have already come forward offering to help. We are keeping a roster of names. It's possible that we may need a few folks to help compiling the results of the surveys or be a short-term participant on a subcommittee that is working on a specific project. We really cannot say exactly what we'll need yet.

Rutland County Free Clinic - Free Health Screening

The Rutland County Free Clinic is providing free health screenings on Saturday, April 1st from 9:00 - Noon in the Klock Room at the Gilbert Hart Library at 14 South Main Street, Wallingford.

If you are uninsured or underinsured (cannot afford the office visit fee or medication) or currently have no primary care doctor, you are invited to join us for a health screening performed by a registered nurse. The health screening will include weight and temperature check, pulse/heart rate, blood pressure, blood sugar and blood oxygen monitoring. There will also be free first aid kits and oral health care supplies as well as nicotine dependency intervention/treatment.

To Wallingford Residents:

The Selectboard has proposed a \$1,426,795.24 budget for fiscal year 2024 that would require \$1,051,133.39 to be raised in taxes. This would add \$0.0573 (estimated) to the municipal tax rate of \$0.3939. Here is a closer look at the numbers:

On the Revenue side, line #4503 Ordinance Fines was increased \$2,500 in anticipation of additional police patrols and line #4514 Transfer Station was increased \$15,000 as a result of FY'22 income totals and fees to date in FY'23.

On the expense side:

Administration Budget. Social Security Cost of Living (COLA) is 8.7 percent. The Board approved 5 percent employee raises. The zoning administrator is putting in more hours each month, so there was an increase to zoning salary line 5004. Note, line 5008 transfer station salaries was level funded- we budgeted for a new employee taking the place of a longtime employee so hourly rates were adjusted but transfer station employees would also receive 5 percent increases. The overall Administration budget is up about 4.6 percent.

Town Government. Legal expenses line 5115 was reduced from \$5,000 to \$3,000 to offset increases elsewhere including line #5155 Rutland County Tax (up about \$3,000 and which the Town has no control). The overall Town Government spending is up just under \$1,400.

Appropriations. Most line items were level-funded. Gilbert Hart Library requested a \$2,000 increase from \$38,000 to \$40,000. The total Appropriation increase was less than \$3,300.

Highway Department. Increased prices for fuel and materials impacted the proposed Highway budget. Town garage operating expenses line 5301 is up \$3,550 (heating fuel, etc.); Diesel fuel line 5315 is up \$6,875; we reduced winter sand line 5318 from \$38,100 to \$35,000; level funded winter salt line 5319 at \$60,000; increased gravel line 5323 by \$17,500 as a result of a projected 30 percent material increase; and paving line 5325 is up \$10,000 also due to rising material costs.

The overall Highway budget is up \$35,185 mainly due to gravel and paving.

Public Safety. With feedback from residents, the Board increased line 5406 Special Officer Contract for sheriff patrols from \$46,000 to \$57,900. This will give us 24 hours of coverage a week rather than 20 hours. We had discussed even more hours with Sheriff David Fox, but he indicated staffing could be an issue. The overall public safety budget is up \$11,900.

Capital budget was reduced slightly - \$235.

Recreation. Salary increases for the Summer Recreation program and Elfin Lake are reflected on lines 5801 and 5901. Most other lines items are up slightly due in large part to the rising cost of doing business. The overall Recreation budget is up \$4,750.

The Selectboard begin working on the proposed budget in mid-November. Highway, Recreation, Conservation, Energy, Zoning, Gilbert Hart Library, Wallingford Rescue, Mt. Holly Rescue, the assessor, and the Rutland County sheriff were all given the opportunity to attend meetings or provide input. Agendas were posted to alert residents which sections of the budget would be discussed at meetings. After a lot of input, the Board presents the Fiscal Year 2024 budget that will meet the needs of the municipality while keeping in mind the impact on taxpayers' wallets. We urge citizens to support this spending plan.

Registering Posted Property. Putting up posted signs conveys a message to ask first or keep out. For extra assurance, you can choose to register your posted land. Often referred to 'legally posted,' it means hunting, fishing and/or trapping is prohibited without written permission. The landowner may maintain signs that: Prohibit hunting, fishing or trapping; Prohibit any combination of the three; or State all or any combination of the three are allowed by Permission Only. To meet the full requirements of the law (10 V.S.A, § 5201 to 5206), the posting must be recorded annually with the town clerk for a fee of \$5.




