Selectboard Meeting Highlights

6/05. The Board approved following the advice of the town attorney regarding the Development Review Board matter in Environmental Court, following executive session. The Selectboard: 1) approved the Wallingford Day fireworks display permit; 2) discussed GMP's requirement to attach a banner across Route 7; 3) appointed M. DeLorme to the Wallingford Day subcommittee upon J. Galusha-Brother's resignation (after an appointment error); 4) approved several ARPA grants upon the Committee's recommendations; 5) approved the Road Commissioner's recommendation to sell the 2014 International Truck; 6) received a status report on possible paving projects; the Maple Street bridge retaining wall project; the VTrans Structures grant to pave the Creek Road Bridge; and recent chloride purchase; 7) approved the purchase of a Milton CAT mulching head; 8) discussed the E. Wallingford FD ARPA request to purchase a pumper/tanker; 9) declined the Baptist Church's ARPA grant application; 10) approved the Cott Systems contract for digitizing land records; 11) granted permission for the Energy Committee to hire a mechanical engineer to assist with the Request for Proposals to insulate Town Hall, install heat pumps and replace the boiler; 12) discussed Recreation Committee purchase requests with Chair Seo and member S. Pytlik; 13) agreed to post a Conservation Commission vacancy; 14) appointed J. Barbieri as DRB alternate; 15) approved to switch the dental plan effective 7/1; 16) approved hiring VHB Consultants to design School Street sidewalks; 17) approved issuing letters to owners of unregistered dogs to register their pets by 6/29 or be assessed civil penalties; 18) agreed to revisit the Street Excavation Permit requirement; 19) announced the Town was awarded \$18,000 in FY24 for a grants in aid for road segment improvements; and 20) approved FY24 employee raises.


06/19. The Selectboard: 1) approved the Sheriff's contract starting 7/1; 2) heard a progress report on Wallingford Day; 3) approved a liquor license application for the Wallingford Village Market; 4) approved the library's request to use the town's bulk mail permit; 5) approved holding only one meeting next month on 7/17; 6) approved the Rec Committee's request to hook up water at the rec field and security camera purchases for the rec field as well, staying within the FY23 budget; 7) approved the Energy Committee's Requests for Proposals for Town Hall weatherization, painting, sealing air leaks and insulating the basement; 8) appointed Tom Fort to the Energy Committee; 9) approved the VHB contract for design services for School Street sidewalks; and 10) agreed the road crew should switch back from four 10-hour days to five 8-hour days until the Road Foreman requests that change.




