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Selectboard Meeting Highlights

7/17. The Board approved: 1) the last pay order of FY23; 2) the appointment D. Eddy to the Conservation Commission; 3) replacing the Town Hall fire escape light; 4) Champlain Valley Fuel for heating oil for the 23-24 winter season; and 5) extending the contract for the Elfin Lake beach erosion.

Road Commissioner Baker gave an overview of the recent infrastructure storm damage to roads and bridges; and he was hired to perform some of the work. P. Baker was also hired for roadside mowing. Paving bids were tabled until Mr. Baker checks with the contractors on a per road estimate.

The last quarter preliminary financials were discussed and a year end surplus of approximately \$79,000 is expected. The Selectboard approved one additional FY23 expense for the water at the recreation field, which will reduce the surplus.

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

EXCITING NEWS

Discover Books installed a book bin at the Wallingford Transfer Station for the collection of clean, good conditioned, hard and soft covered books, CDs, DVDs and audiobooks (no garbage or other recyclables should go in the book bin). Discover Books will sort through these items for distribution to others AND it keeps them out of the solid waste stream. The Transfer Station employees ask that you make sure items are clean and in good condition and separated from Zero Sort recyclables before you arrive at the facility so the drop off is quick.

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What does the E. coli test result mean?

E. coli in water is measured as the number of bacteria found in 100 milliliters (mL) of water. In Vermont, when the test result at a public swimming area is 235 E. coli/100 mL or less, it means that the water is considered suitable for swimming. A result greater than 235 E. coli/100 mL means that the water is not considered suitable for swimming. <u>Elfin Lake water was tested July 19, 2023 and the result was 25 E. coli/100 mL – well below the 235 threshold.</u>















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
