#### **Homestead Declaration**

✓ If you are a Vermont resident, don't forget to file your annual Homestead Declaration form with the Vermont Department of Taxes, even if you do not have to file a state income tax return.

#### **Dog Registrations**

✓ All dogs, six months of age or older, must be registered annually at the Town Clerk's Office by April 1<sup>st</sup>. A valid rabies certificate must be submitted, and we're happy to issue licenses by mail. Fees are \$10 spayed/neutered; otherwise, it's \$14.

We will be holding our annual dog/cat rabies clinic in March. Watch for further details.

#### Want to Run for Office?

Thinking about serving your community? If so, you must submit a petition, signed by at least 1% of registered voters (16), and a candidate consent form to the Town Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 29th. Forms are available at the Town Clerk's Office, under Documents on the Town website, or on the VT Secretary of State's website (sos.vermont.gov).

Petitioned Articles (public questions) for the Town Meeting ballot, signed by at least 5% of registered voters (80), are due in the Town Clerk's Office by 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, January 18th.



The Selectboard: 1) heard an update from Road Commissioner Baker on town garage flood repairs, repairing property damage on Homer Stone Road, getting the mulcher connected to the excavator to get started on roadside mowing of East Street, and applying for a Better Roads grant; 2) discussed the FY'25 Public Safety, Town Government and Capital budgets; 3) approved a Town Hall use for dance classes; 4) reviewed upcoming tax sales; 5) approved the ARPA allocation resolution; and 6) discussed a new telephone system for Town Hall and copier.

12/18. The Selectboard: 1) discussed the School Street Sidewalk project; 2) discussed the FY'25 Highway, Appropriations and Recreation budgets; 3) approved the Town Meeting articles for ARPA fund allocation; 4) set the Transfer Station hourly salary for substitute help; 5) accepted the Conservation Commission registration; 6) approved the Flashing Radar Sign purchases; 7) signed the VEM house buyout; 8) approved holiday gift cards for employees; 9) rescheduled the first January Board meeting; 10) discussed the Town Hall key/code and telephone systems.



Voters at Town Meeting in March will be asked to approve two special articles to establish and fund the Wallingford Asset Fund in order to pay for American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) projects recommended by the Town's ARPA Committee and approved by the Selectboard. ARPA funds were distributed nationwide to

every municipality to offset impacts from the pandemic. But the funds came with specific deadline requirements – the money must be obligated by December 31, 2024 and spent by December 31, 2026.

Town of Wallingford infrastructure projects like the School Street sidewalks and the purchase of a fire truck for the East Wallingford Fire Department may extend beyond the 2026 federal spending deadline for these ARPA funds and this posed a risk of the Town losing the money. Therefore, the Selectboard followed Vermont League of Cities and Town's (VLCT) recommendation to transfer ARPA funds into the municipal general account in order to meet the deadline. VLCT's Katie Buckley explained transferring ARPA funds to the general account would create a surplus in the current budget year. This surplus would then go into the Wallingford Asset Fund and be used in the next few years for all of the ARPA projects approved by the Selectboard. Transferring the funds enables the Town to report to the federal government in April of 2024 that ARPA funds have been spent, thus satisfying their deadline requirements.

The Selectboard voted on December 4, 2023 to transfer \$466,789 in ARPA funds to the municipal general account to eliminate the risk of losing this money. As a result of these one-time, unanticipated funds, they are seeking voter approval at Town Meeting to establish and fund the Wallingford Asset Fund that will pay for an array of projects thoroughly reviewed by the ARPA Committee and approved by the Selectboard. Those projects include repairs to community water systems, flashing radar signs to be installed on Main Street and Route 140W, rehabilitation of School Street sidewalks, weatherization of Town Hall, digitization of Town Hall records, and much more. The Selectboard urges voters to approve Town Meeting Warning Article V asking voters to establish the Wallingford Asset Fund and Article VI asking voters to fund it with the Fiscal Year 2024 surplus resulting from this one-time influx of ARPA money into the general funds.


