Wallingford's Townwide Reappraisal

The Town has hired New England Municipal Resource Center (NEMRC) to perform a townwide reassessment. NEMRC will be doing property inspections starting this fall. The project will be complete for April 1, 2026 assessments. The last reappraisal was completed in 2018. Since that time, market values have dramatically increased causing a state-required reappraisal. Some properties have

changed in land size, building size, building costs, added or taken away outbuildings, improvements, additional age, sales at higher than assessed value, etc. With these changes comes inequity in the data used for assessing properties. The State of Vermont has ordered the Town to complete a reappraisal to bring assessments to Fair Market Value.

DURING THE NEXT TWO YEARS, a postcard will be sent to you prior to making inspection visits in your neighborhood. **IF you wish to make an appointment at that time for an interior inspection**, that can be arranged by calling the phone number provided.

Otherwise, the inspector will perform, at a minimum, an exterior inspection verifying data and taking new photographs. The inspector will leave a card showing the date the property was inspected, contact information for an interior inspection *if desired*, and a code to view information on NEMRC's Online Property Data Verification (OPDV) website. Owners can log onto the OPDV website, view their information and the main dwelling. It does not show outbuildings. There is a place to leave comments or ask questions. It does not show values.

New assessments will be mailed at the end of the process. Wallingford has over 1,200 properties so we thank you for your cooperation and appreciate your patience.

NEW Zoning Regulations

Voters will be asked to approve proposed zoning on the November election ballot. To review the draft zoning regulations, visit the municipal website at www.wallingfordvt.com and find a link on the Home page as well as the Planning Commission page for the August 5th version of proposed zoning.

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Selectboard Meeting Highlights

8/05. The Selectboard: 1) heard a report that the Road Commissioner found the paving job on N. End Drive satisfactory; 2) agreed to explore options for communication among road crew workers in areas without cell service; 3) approved the municipal tax rate of \$.4513; 4) approved assessing the Homestead Late Filing Penalty; 5) discussed receiving no bids on the RFPs for Heating & Cooling Systems at Town Hall. After a lengthy discussion, the Board approved modifying the Heat Pump RFP to include installation of heat pumps on the first floor and the option to include a separate cost for installing heat pumps on the second floor. 6) Three of the Recreation Facility Subcommittee members gave an update on their work including plans to submit a grant application for the Elfin Lake public beach erosion reduction measures and a separate grant for upgrades to the Concession stand. 7) agreed to place an item on the November ballot asking voters to approve the revised zoning regulations; 8) approved the Gilbert Hart Library Trustees' recommendation to appoint Todd Galiano as Selectboard liaison; 9) accepted the Wallingford Day and Shade Tree Committee Resignations of Maria French, Shannon Pytlik and Denise Eddy. 10) authorized K. Luzader to sign revised documents related to the Buyout Program for the Hunter property at 33 Weston Road; and 11) heard a report on the Stan Taylor West Hill Road lot line adjustment application.

8/17. The Selectboard: 1) Heard a report that the Town was awarded a Better Roads grant of \$8,096 for a state required Road Erosion Inventory; 2) discussed roadside mowing and the Route 7 and 140E radar signs; 3) discussed the heat pump bid received along with determining electrical needs for the heating and cooling system on the second floor; 4) directed the Town Administrator to contact Champlain Valley Fuel to extend fuel oil purchases at the same per gallon rate as last winter; 5) approved Eric McKee working with the Town's Recreation Committee on flag football as a Rec event at municipal facilities this month and next; 6) approved the question related to proposed zoning be included on the November election ballot mailed out by the state at no cost to the Town; 7) the Town Administrator reported on the Town Hall painting and caulking work was completed and inspected by T. Fort; 8) approved moving the first meeting of next month to Tuesday, 9/3 due to the Labor Day holiday; 9) discussed the reappraisal notifications; and 10) approved hiring Hubbard Brothers to pump the concession stand septic tank and inspect the system for any issues related to toilets overflowing. The building will not be boarded up until the Recreation Committee can get a contractor's estimate for upgrades.

Our robust Phase 2 engagement strategy includes town board presentations, pop-up events, hybrid feedback sessions, an online survey, and a video presentation to make it easy for you to participate.

The VT Department of Taxes set the Homestead Education Tax Rate at \$1.6978 (up 7 cents) and the Nonhomestead Education Tax Rate at \$1.8098 (up 15 cents).

The Selectboard set the Municipal Tax Rate at \$.4513. The Fire Protection Tax Rate for districts 1 & 3 is \$.0896, and the Tax Rate for Fire District 2 is unknown at this time. Tax bills were mailed out the second week of August. The first half payment is due on October 21st.

Mill River Union High School will host a 5K cross country meet on Saturday, September 21st with a rain date of Saturday, September 28th. Invited high school runners will be gathering in the morning at the ballfield off Meadow Street after 8:00 a.m. They may walk the course before the actual race. The girls' race will start at 10:00 a.m. and the boys' race starts at 10:45 a.m. The event should conclude by noon. Motorists please be alert for runners crossing Waldo Lane at various times.



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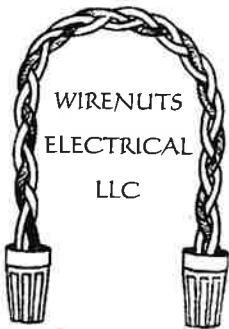
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
