Selectboard Meeting Highlights

11/04. The Selectboard: 1) discussed the status of repairing the Boy with the Boot. L. Arsenault presented a painting of the Boy with ideas to display it until the statue is reinstalled. No decision was made; 2) received RRPC's notice that their annual dues will now be based on per capita raising it from \$1,000 to \$2,129 next year for the town; 3) discussed solar panels for the town garage and also the sand shed with Energy Committee Chair T. Fort. Approval was given for structural engineer assessments of both structures, to remove two nearby trees, and for the contractor's estimates to include installing panels on the garage, sand shed or both; 4) discussed installing No Parking after Dark signs at Stone Meadow. No decision was made; 5) discussed the upcoming budget meetings; 6) congratulated the Rec Committee and Town on the new Elfin Lake erosion reduction grant award; and 7) discussed R. Barker attending the Restorative Justice meetings related to the Eflin Lake vandalism complaint involving area youths.



11/18. The Selectboard: 1) discussed the Better Roads grant application for a culvert replacement on Senecal Way and a hydraulic study; 2) Zoning Administrator E. Berner provided an update on the zoning regs approved by the voters as well as the work that will begin in order to update the Town Plan; 3) opened the Solar Panel bids received from four contractors and tabled any decision until the structural assessments were available; 4) heard from C. Betit on her recommendation to conduct a digital Need & Risk Assessment survey, rather than a paper one, on telecommunication needs during power outages or other emergency situations as part of a ARPA award; 5) discussed new software available from our tax mappers for GIS and other purposes; 6) heard a status report on the School Street sidewalk grant and authorized the Chair to sign the attorney's letter that is a grant requirement; 7) approved the same BCBS health insurance plans for 2025 based on premiums; and 8) discussed the FY26 budget planning that will begin at the next meeting.

Greetings from Mill River Unified Union School District. We are in the final phase of FY26 budget drafting. During our 10/29 finance committee meeting, we had a new rollover "lite" budget presented (with a 3% expense increase) as well as 2% and 0% increase budgets as requested. A budget with no increase in expenses would call for staff layoffs, and the finance committee feels this would damage students' educational opportunities. The finance committee favors the 3% increase budget with the addition of 2 elementary school math interventionists. These changes will raise the expenditure increase to about 4%. For the past few years, the district has prioritized reading interventionists at the elementary level, and there have been good results. There appears to be public and district staff support for complementing this success with elementary math intervention. District staff proposed adding 4 math interventionist positions to support the 4 elementary schools, but the finance committee has asked for a scaled down proposal with 2 interventionists being shared by the 4 schools.

On 10/31, Governor Scott's office issued another statement on school budgeting, reiterating his recommendation to districts to stabilize tax increases to the single digits. This is a goal that we have been and will continue to work towards.

An important milestone clarifying the district budgeting process comes with the "12/1 letter" from Vermont's Commissioner of Taxes. The important take home of the letter is that it will give us a tax rate projection that will clarify what our district tax rate will be, prior to town rate CLA fluctuations.

For context: The tax rate projection is based on a projection of the coming fiscal year's education fund (which includes an assessment of statewide property values, VT general fund disbursement, VT sales tax revenues, and VT state lottery revenues) and individual district budgeting and our corresponding projected spending per pupil.

If other districts are running up expenses in their budgets, then we could see signs of 18% increases like last year. If districts around the state are working to keep budgets trim, we might see something more like 9%. How this affects us as a district depends on how our budgeted local district per pupil spending comes in vs. the yield, which is the per pupil spending allowed by an equalized (\$1/\$100 property value) tax rate.

When last year's 12/1 letter came out, we learned that the state predicted a smaller amount available in the education fund, with districts reporting higher expense forecasts than anticipated. At that point, we didn't have a solid per pupil number (as a new act governing new pupil weighting was coming into effect) so we could only ballpark the tax impacts, but there were several adjustments through mid-January that shifted that per pupil a few times (all slightly in our favor). This year we hope to have clarity on our weighted pupil number sooner, which would lead to more reliable projections for the district tax rate.

By our next finance meeting on 12/12 at 5:30 p.m., we will have the state's tax rate projection and our draft for MRUUSD's FY26 budget. We will also discuss strategy around our district's surplus and ways we may address funding for big-ticket buildings and grounds infrastructure expenses. This is the last scheduled district finance meeting before a finalized budget goes to the full board for approval. Again, community participation is appreciated and encouraged.

Snowplowing Reminders

Reminder – **Winter Parking Ban in effect November 15th through March 31st.** No parking allowed on Wallingford roads between the hours of 11 p.m. and 7 a.m.

It is unlawful to plow snow across a town highway or street in a way that leaves snow in the roadway. Violation of this law may result in a \$100.00 fine plus the actual costs of repairing any damage resulting from such obstruction of the highway. (Title 19 V.S.A. 1105)

It is unlawful to cause water or ice to run onto a town highway or street in such a way that it causes damage to the highway or street, obstructs traffic, or creates unsafe conditions. (Title 19 V.S.A. 1111)

The Town of Wallingford is not responsible for vegetation, structures, fences, or mailboxes within town highway rights-of-way damaged during snowplowing. (Title 19 V.S.A. 904, 1111).

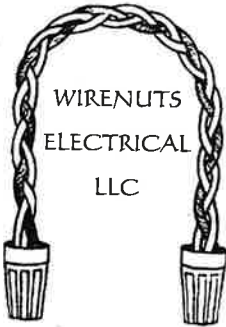
