2026 DOG LICENSES AVAILABLE

Vermont state law requires all dogs, aged 6 months and older, to be registered by April 1st each year. If you become a dog owner after April 1st, you will need to license your dog within 30 days.

The fee to purchase dog licenses are as follows: \$12.00 for all dogs that have been spayed or neutered; otherwise, the fee is \$16.00



Dog licenses are available at the Town Clerk's Office. A current rabies certificate and payment is required. You may register your dog(s) in person, by mail, online or drop your payment through the front door

mail slot at the Town Hall. Please provide the following: A copy of the most current Rabies Certificate and Payment. Online payments can be made at <https://www.wallingfordvt.com>. ~ Homestead Declaration ~

By Vermont law, property owners whose homes meet the definition of a Vermont homestead must file a Homestead Declaration annually by the April filing deadline-April 15, 2026.



In Vermont, all property is subject to education property tax to pay for the state's schools. For this purpose, the property is categorized as either nonhomestead or homestead. All property is considered nonhomestead unless it is declared as a homestead. The education property tax rate levied on nonhomestead property differs from the rate levied on homestead property.

It is your responsibility as the property owner to claim the property as a homestead if you meet, or expect to meet, the following requirements: 1) You are a Vermont resident and 2) You own and occupy a homestead as your domicile as of 4/1/2026.

How to File: Online - Taxpayers may file returns using myVTax at myVTax.vermont.gov, the state's free, secure online filing site. Paper Returns - If you cannot file and pay through myVTax, you may still use the paper forms. The Homestead Declaration is filed using Form HS-122, the Homestead Declaration, and Property Tax Credit Claim.

Most file the Homestead Declaration with the VT income tax return. However, if you apply to extend the time to file your income tax return, *the Homestead Declaration must still be filed by the April filing deadline*. Even if you are not required to file a Vermont Income Tax Return, the declaration must STILL be filed by the deadline.



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## \*\*Snowplowing Reminders\*\*

Winter Parking Ban is in effect now until March 31<sup>st</sup>. No parking allowed on Wallingford roads, **this includes Route 7 and School Street**, between the hours of 11pm and 7am.

It is unlawful to plow snow across a town highway or street in a way that leaves snow in the roadway. Violation of this law may result in a \$100 fine plus the actual cost of repairing any damage resulting from such obstruction of the roadway. (Title 19V.S.A. 1105)



It is unlawful to cause water or ice to run onto a town highway or street in such a way that causes damage to the highway or street, obstructs traffic or creates unsafe conditions. (Title 19 V.S.A. 1111)

The Town of Wallingford is not responsible for vegetation, structures, fences or mailboxes within town highway rights-of-way damaged during snowplowing. (Title 19 V.S.A. 904, 1111)

### Veterans & Property Taxes What You Should Know

Don't forget to file your application to receive the 2026 Property Tax Exemption for Disabled Veterans and their Survivors before May 1<sup>st</sup>.

The following are eligible for the exemption: Veterans receiving Disability Compensation at a rating of 50% or higher; Veterans receiving Non-Service Connected Pension, aka V.A. Pension or Widower's Pension: or Military retirement pay for a permanent medical military retirement.

The exemption is \$40,000 in Wallingford. The exemption reduces the appraised value of the home prior to the assessment of taxes. The exemption only applies to Primary Residences that are owned by the veteran or survivor.

To receive the exemption, the veteran must provide proof of eligibility to the Vermont Office of Veterans Affairs every year. Veterans who are determined to be totally and permanently disabled only have to provide proof of eligibility the first year they use the benefit for a home (if they move to a new home in a different town, they will have to provide proof of eligibility again). Proof of eligibility is provided by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Need Help? Call the Vermont office of Veterans Affairs at (802) 828-3379.

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
